1.1	A bill for an act
1.2	relating to state government; expanding duties and powers of the Council on
1.3	Black Minnesotans; amending Minnesota Statutes 2012, section 3.9225.

1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

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1.5 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2012, section 3.9225, is amended to read:
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1.6 **3.9225 COUNCIL ON BLACK MINNESOTANS.**

1.7 Subdivision 1. Creation. A state Council on Black Minnesotans (COBM) consists
1.8 of 13 15 members appointed by the governor. The members of the council must be broadly
1.9 representative of the Black community of the state and include at least five males and at

1.10 least five females. One member of the council must be a person whose ethnic heritage is

1.11 from West Africa, and one member of the council must be a person whose ethnic heritage

- 1.12 is from East Africa. There must be equal representation of African Americans, East
- 1.13 Africans, and West Africans on the council. Membership terms, compensation, removal of
- 1.14 members, and filling of vacancies for nonlegislative members are as provided in section
- 1.15 15.0575. Because the council performs functions that are not purely advisory, the council
- 1.16 is not subject to the expiration date in section 15.059. Two members of the house of
- 1.17 representatives appointed by the speaker and two members of the senate appointed by
- 1.18 the Subcommittee on Committees of the Committee on Rules and Administration shall
- 1.19 serve as nonvoting members of the council. The council shall annually elect from its
- 1.20 membership a chair and other officers it deems necessary.
- 1.21 Subd. 2. **Definitions.** For the purpose of this section:
- 1.22 (1) "Black" describes persons who consider themselves as having origin in any of1.23 the Black racial groups of Africa;

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- (2) "East Africa" means the eastern region of the continent of Africa, comprising 2.1 areas occupied by the countries of Burundi, Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania, Uganda, and 2.2 Somalia; and 2.3 (3) "West Africa" means the western region of the continent of Africa comprising 2.4 areas occupied by the countries of Mauritania, Senegal, The Gambia, Guinea-Bissau, 2.5 Guinea, Sierra Leone, Liberia, Cote d'Ivoire, Ghana, Togo, Benin, Nigeria, Burkina Faso, 2.6 and those parts of Mali and Niger south of the Sahara. 2.7 Subd. 3. **Duties.** The council shall: 28 (a) advise brief the governor and the legislature legislative leaders face-to-face on 2.9 the nature of the issues confronting policy and administrative matters of concern to Black 2.10 people in this state Minnesotans and the COBM; 2.11 (b) advise the governor and the legislature on statutes or rules necessary to ensure 2.12 that Black people have access to benefits and services provided to people in this state; 2.13 (c) recommend to the governor and the legislature any revisions in the state's 2.14 affirmative action program and other steps that are necessary to eliminate underutilization 2.15 of Blacks in the state's work force; 2.16 (d) recommend to the governor and the legislature legislation to improve the 2.17 economic and social condition of Black people in this state; 2.18 (e) serve as a conduit to state government for organizations of Black people in 2.19 the state: 2.20(f) serve as a referral agency to assist Black people to secure access to state agencies 2.21 and programs; 2.22 2.23 (g) serve as a liaison with the federal government, local government units, and private organizations on matters relating to the Black people of this state; 2.24 (h) perform or contract for the performance of studies designed to suggest solutions 2.25 to problems of Black people in the areas of education, employment, human rights, health, 2.26 housing, social welfare, and other related areas; 2.27 (i) implement programs designed to solve problems of Black people when authorized 2.28 by other statute, rule, or order; 2.29 (j) review data provided by the commissioner of human services under section 2.30 260C.215, subdivision 5, and present recommendations on the out-of-home placement 2.31 of Black children. Recommendations must be presented to the commissioner and the 2.32 legislature by February 1, 1990; November 1, 1990; and November 1 of each year 2.33 thereafter; and 2.34 (k) publicize the accomplishments of Black people and their contributions to this 2.35

Review of grant applications. Powers. (a) The council may contract in its own name, but no money shall 3.11 be accepted or received as a loan nor indebtedness incurred except as otherwise provided 3.12 by law. Contracts shall be approved by a majority of the members of the council and 3.13 executed by the chair and the executive director. The council may apply for, receive, and 3.14 expend in its own name grants and gifts of money consistent with the power and duties 3.15 specified in subdivisions 1 to 7. 3.16 (b) The council may solicit and accept payments for advertising, use of exhibition 3.17 space, or commemorative videos or other items in connection with publications, events, 3.18 media productions, and informational programs that are sponsored by the council. These 3.19 revenues must be deposited in an account in the special revenue fund and are appropriated 3.20 to the council to defray costs of publications, events, media productions, or informational 3.21 programs consistent with the powers and duties specified in subdivisions 1 to 7. The 3.22 council may not publish advertising or provide exhibition space for any elected official 3.23

(c) The council shall appoint an executive director who is experienced in 3.28 administrative activities and familiar with the problems and needs of Black people. The 3.29 council may delegate to the executive director powers and duties under subdivisions 1 to 7 3.30 which do not require council approval. The executive director serves in the unclassified 3.31 and staff members serve in the classified service and may be removed at any time by the 3.32 eouncil. The executive director shall recommend to the council, and the council may 3.33 appoint the appropriate staff necessary to carry out its duties. Staff members serve in the 3.34 unclassified service. The commissioner of administration shall provide the council with 3.35 necessary administrative services. 3.36
