1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Laws 2016, chapter 189, article 3, section 6, as amended by Laws 2017, chapter
1.7 93, article 1, section 12, is amended to read:

1.9 \$250,000 the first year is from the state forest
1.10 suspense account in the permanent school fund
1.11 for the school trust lands director to initiate
1.12 real-estate development projects on and
1.13 complete a 25-year framework for managing
1.14 school trust lands as determined by the school
1.15 trust lands director described in Minnesota
1.16 Statutes, section 127A.353, subdivision 4,
1.17 paragraph (a), clause (6). This is a onetime
1.18 appropriation and is available until June 30,
1.19 2019 expended.
