1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 97A.441, subdivision 5, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 5. Angling; disabled veterans. (a) Upon being furnished satisfactory
1.8	evidence as described in subdivision 6b, a person authorized to issue licenses must issue,
1.9	without a fee, a permanent license to take fish by angling to a resident who is a veteran,
1.10	as defined in section 197.447, and that has a 100 percent service connected disability as
1.11	defined by the United States Veterans Administration upon being furnished satisfactory

3.4	affairs verifying the veteran's disability compensation rating to the commissioner.
3.5	When a veteran satisfies the requirements of this paragraph, the commissioner shall issue
3.6	the permanent card to the veteran.
3.7	(b) A driver's license or Minnesota identification card bearing the designation under
3.8	section 171.07, subdivision 15, paragraph (a), clause (2), serves as satisfactory evidence to
3.9	obtain a license under subdivision 5, 6, or 6a at all agent locations.
