1.10 the geographical boundaries of the tribe's reservation to enforce state criminal law.

1.12 Subd. 4. **Cooperative agreements.** In order to coordinate, define, and regulate the

1.13 provision of law enforcement services and to provide for mutual aid and cooperation,

1.14 governmental units and the tribe ~~shall~~ may enter into agreements under section 471.59. For

1.15 the purposes of entering into these agreements, the tribe ~~shall be~~ is considered a

1.16 "governmental unit" as that term is defined in section 471.59, subdivision 1.
