2.3 (3) has passed a test of the applicant's eyesight;

2.4 (4) has passed a department-administered test of the applicant's knowledge of traffic

2.6 (5) has completed the required application, which must be approved by (i) either
2.7 parent when both reside in the same household as the minor applicant or, if otherwise,
2.8 then (ii) the parent or spouse of the parent having custody or, in the event there is no court
2.9 order for custody, then (iii) the parent or spouse of the parent with whom the minor is
2.10 living or, if items (i) ~~to~~ through (iii) do not apply, then (iv) the guardian having custody of
2.11 the minor, ~~(v) the foster parent or the director of the transitional living program in which~~
2.12 ~~the child resides~~ or, in the event a person under the age of 18 has no living father, mother,

2.21 (b) The instruction permit is valid for two years from the date of application and
2.22 may be renewed upon payment of a fee equal to the fee for issuance of an instruction
2.23 permit under section 171.06, subdivision 2.
