1.6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.7 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 171.12, subdivision 7b, is amended to read:

1.8 Subd. 7b. **Data privacy; noncompliant license or identification card.** (a) With respect

1.9 to noncompliant licenses or identification cards, the commissioner is prohibited from:

1.10 (1) electronically disseminating outside the state data that is not disseminated as of May

1.11 19, 2017; or

1.12 (2) utilizing any electronic validation or verification system accessible from or maintained

1.13 outside the state that is not in use as of May 19, 2017.

1.14 (b) The limitations in paragraph (a) do not apply to the extent necessary to: (1) maintain

1.15 compliance with the driver's license compact under section 171.50 and applicable federal

1.16 law governing commercial driver's licenses; and (2) perform identity verification as part of

1.17 an application for a replacement Social Security card issued by the Social Security

1.18 Administration.

1.19 (c) For purposes of this subdivision, "outside the state" includes federal agencies, states

1.20 other than Minnesota, organizations operating under agreement among the states, and private

1.21 entities.

1.22 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.
