1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. [84.8035] NONRESIDENT OFF-ROAD VEHICLE STATE TRAIL
1.6	PASS.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Pass required; fee. (a) A nonresident may not operate an off-road
1.8	vehicle on a state or grant-in-aid off-road vehicle trail unless the vehicle displays a
1.9	nonresident off-road vehicle state trail pass sticker issued according to this section.
1.10	The pass must be viewable by a peace officer, a conservation officer, or an employee
1.11	designated under section 84.0835.
1.12	(b) The fee for an annual pass is \$20. The pass is valid from January 1 through
1.13	December 31. The fee for a three-year pass is \$30. The commissioner of natural resources
1.14	shall issue a pass upon application and payment of the fee. Fees collected under this
1.15	section, except for the issuing fee for licensing agents, shall be deposited in the state
1.16	treasury and credited to the off-road vehicle account in the natural resources fund and,
1.17	except for the electronic licensing system commission established by the commissioner
1.18	under section 84.027, subdivision 15, must be used for grants-in-aid to counties and
1.19	municipalities for off-road vehicle organizations to construct and maintain off-road
1.20	vehicle trails and use areas.
1.21	(c) A nonresident off-road vehicle state trail pass is not required for:
1.22	(1) an off-road vehicle that is owned and used by the United States, another state,
1.23	or a political subdivision thereof that is exempt from registration under section 84.798,

2.5	Subd. 2. License agents. The commissioner may appoint agents to issue and
2.6	sell nonresident off-road vehicle state trail passes. The commissioner may revoke the
2.7	appointment of an agent at any time. The commissioner may adopt additional rules as
2.8	provided in section 97A.485, subdivision 11. An agent shall observe all rules adopted
2.9	by the commissioner for accounting and handling of passes pursuant to section 97A.485,
2.10	subdivision 11. An agent shall promptly deposit and remit all money received from the
2.11	sale of the passes, exclusive of the issuing fee, to the commissioner.
2.12	Subd. 3. Issuance of passes. The commissioner and agents shall issue and sell
2.13	nonresident off-road vehicle state trail passes. The commissioner shall also make the
2.14	passes available through the electronic licensing system established under section 84.027,
2.15	subdivision 15.
2.16	Subd. 4. Agent's fee. In addition to the fee for a pass, an issuing fee of \$1 per pass
2.17	shall be charged. The issuing fee may be retained by the seller of the pass. Issuing fees for
2.18	passes issued by the commissioner shall be deposited in the off-road vehicle account in the
2.19	natural resources fund and retained for the operation of the electronic licensing system.
2.20	Subd. 5. Duplicate passes. The commissioner and agents shall issue a duplicate
2.21	pass to persons whose pass is lost or destroyed using the process established under section
2.22	97A.405, subdivision 3, and rules adopted thereunder. The fee for a duplicate nonresident
2.23	off-road vehicle state trail pass is \$4, with an issuing fee of 50 cents.
