| 1.7 | Subd. 11. Continuing education requirement; random audit. (a) Effective |
| 1.8 | August 1, 2014, to qualify for license renewal under this chapter as an individual |
| 1.9 | cosmetologist, nail technician, esthetician, or salon manager, the applicant must attest to |
| 1.10 | the completion of four hours of continuing education credits. One credit hour of the |
| 1.11 | requirement must include instruction pertaining to state laws and rules governing the |
| 1.12 | practice of cosmetology. Three credit hours must include instruction pertaining to health, |
| 1.13 | safety, and sanitation matters consistent with the United States Department of Labor's |
| 1.14 | Occupational Safety and Health Administration standards applicable to the practice of |
| 1.15 | cosmetology, or other applicable federal health, sanitation, and safety standards, and |
| 1.16 | must be regularly updated so as to incorporate newly developed standards and accepted |
| 1.17 | professional best practices. Credit hours earned are valid for three years and may be |
