

## CHAPTER 156.

AN ACT TO MAKE SECTIONS ONE (1), TWO (2) AND THREE (3) OF CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY (120) OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN (1877) APPLICABLE TO KANDIYOHI COUNTY, RELATIVE TO SALARIES OF COUNTY AUDITORS AND COUNTY TREASURERS OF SUCH COUNTY.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That the provisions of sections one (1), two (2) and three (3) of chapter one hundred and twenty (120) of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven (1877), shall be in full force and effect in the county of Kandiyohi, and be applicable to the County Auditor and County Treasurer of said Kandiyohi county, and that said County Auditor and County Treasurer of Kandiyohi county, shall be paid and compensated for their services according to the provisions of said sections one (1), two (2) and three (3) of chapter one hundred and twenty (120) of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven (1877). *Provided, only, that the Board of County Commissioners of said county may allow the County Treasurer of said Kandiyohi county, besides the compensation of said County Treasurer for his services, by said act fixed, a reasonable compensation for necessary clerk hire, not to exceed in any one year the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.)*

Compensation.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 157.

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE (131) OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIVE (1875), ENTITLED AN ACT TO REGULATE THE CATCHING OF FISH IN FREEBORN LAKE, IN FREEBORN COUNTY, MINNESOTA.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. Section two (2) of chapter one hundred and thirty-one (131) of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five (1875), is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

SEC. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to catch fish in the running waters of said lake or in any of the inlets or outlets of said lakes, with a gill net. Unlawful to catch fish with a gill net.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 158.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR THE GENERAL EXPENSES OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT FOR THE YEARS ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE (1881) AND ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY TWO (1882).

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:*

SECTION 1. That the following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the State Treasury belonging to the general revenue fund not otherwise appropriated for the payment of the general expenses of the State government for the years one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one (1881) and deficiencies of one thousand eight hundred and eighty (1880).

General appropriations for 1881 and 1882.

Deficiency of 1880.

First—For executive contingent fund for State purposes and incidental expenses of the Governor's office, three thousand dollars (\$3,000).

Contingent funds.

Second—For incidental expenses of the Secretary of State's office, four hundred dollars (\$400).

Third—For incidental expenses of the State Auditor's office, five hundred dollars (\$500).

Fourth—For incidental expenses of the State Treasurer's office three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350).

Fifth—For incidental expenses and per diem, as allowed by law, of the Attorney General, one thousand dollars (1,000).

Sixth—For incidental expenses of the Insurance Commissioner's office, three hundred dollars (\$300).

Seventh—For incidental expenses and clerk hire of the Public Examiner, one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500).

Eighth—For incidental expenses of the Railroad Commissioner's office, two hundred dollars (\$200).

Ninth—For incidental expenses of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, five hundred dollars (\$500).

Tenth—For incidental expenses of the State Library, three hundred dollars (\$300).
