

of Norwood and the common council of said village do ordain."

SEC. 2. Fines, penalties and punishments imposed by the village council for the breach of any ordinance, by-law or regulation of said village, may extend to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) and imprisonment in the jail of Carver county not exceeding ninety days, or both, and offenders against the same may be required to give security for their good behavior and to keep the peace for a period not exceeding six (6) months. *Provided*, that the village council may in all regulations of said village in all cases by imprisonment for breach of any ordinance, by-law or for non-payment of any fine imposed by said village justice, provide that said person so imprisoned may be kept to hard labor on the streets and improvements of said village or elsewhere during the term of said imprisonment or until his fine and penalty are paid or commuted at such rate of compensation for such labor as the village council may fix, and said village council may establish all needful rules and regulations for the security of such offender so employed, and from the time of the arrest of any person for any offense until the time of his trial, he may be imprisoned in the jail aforesaid.

SEC. 3. Peter Efferz, M. Limmonitch and August Hartelt are hereby designated as the persons to carry out the provisions of section nine (9) of said chapter one hundred and thirty nine (139) of the general laws of the year one thousand eight hundred seventy-five (1875) and to issue notices of the first (1st) election of officers, to be held in said village under the provisions of this act and the general law hereinbefore referred to; and the secretary of state is hereby directed to issue his official notification of the passage of this act to said persons.

SEC. 4. This act shall take affect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 32.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE VILLAGE OF OLIVIA, IN THE COUNTY OF RENVILLE, STATE OF MINNESOTA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the following described territory in the county of Renville, State of Minnesota, to-wit: All of section seven (7) south half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of section six (6) north half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of section eighteen (18) west half of section eight (8) and northwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section seventeen (17) southwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section five (5) town-

ship of Bird Island, be and the same is hereby constituted the village of Olivia under the provisions of chapter one hundred and thirty-nine (139) of the general laws of the State of Minnesota for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five (1875).

SEC. 2. That Peter Heins, N. Stone and Wm. Christensen are hereby designated commissioners to carry out the provisions of section nine (9) of said chapter, and the secretary of state is hereby directed to issue his official notification of the passage of this act.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 33.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE CITY OF ORTONVILLE IN THE COUNTIES OF BIG STONE AND LAC QUI PARLE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. That the following described territory, to-wit: commencing at a point where the township line between townships one hundred and twenty-one (121) and one hundred and twenty-two (122) of range forty-six (46), intersects the State line, thence east on the line between said townships one hundred and twenty-one (121) and one hundred and twenty-two (122) to the quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post between sections three (3) in township one hundred and twenty-one (121) of range forty-six, and section thirty-four (34) in township one hundred and twenty-two (122) of range forty-six (46) thence south through the centres of sections three (3), ten (10) and fifteen (15) to the quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) post between sections fifteen (15) and twenty-two (22), thence due west to the State line, thence along the State line to the point of beginning, containing all of fractional section five (5), all of section four (4), the west one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of section three (3), the west one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of section ten (10), all of section nine (9), lot one (1) of section eight (8), all of section sixteen (16) and the west one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of section fifteen (15), town one hundred and twenty-one (121) of range forty-six (46), in Big Stone and Lac qui Parle counties, Minnesota, is hereby set apart and incorporated as the city of Ortonville, under the provisions of chapter one hundred and thirty-nine (139) of the general laws of the State of Minnesota for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five (1875), and the amendments thereto.

SEC. 2. That Ferdinand Shumaker, Bernhard Dassel, and M. D. Hartnett, are hereby designated commissioners to carry out the provisions of section nine (9) of said chapter, and the secretary of
