

CHAPTER 347.

AN ACT for the protection of fish in Lake Hanska, Brown county.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That no person shall take, catch or fish for any fish, in any way or manner whatever, from Lake Hanska, in Brown county, or any of the inlets or outlets thereof, save as herein after stated.

SEC. 2. All persons may fish in said lake and streams with hook and line, and nets with meshes not less than one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) inches square, save during the months of March and April in each and every year.

SEC. 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this act shall be punished by fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) and not less than five dollars (\$5), or imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding three months, or both such fine and imprisonment.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 348.

AN ACT to prohibit the catching of fish in the creek running out of Lake Whipple, Pope county.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to catch fish in any manner during the months of March, April and May in each year, in Lake Whipple, within forty (40) rods of the mouth of the creek running out of said lake, or in said creek, between Lake Whipple and Lake Emely.

SEC. 2. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before any court having competent jurisdiction, shall be fined the sum of five dollars (\$5) for every fish caught.

SEC. 3. The fines collected under the provisions of this chapter shall be paid into the county treasury of Pope county, for the use of the common schools.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
