

prohibit any inhabitant who has heretofore been elected to any town office from serving out his unexpired term of office.

SEC. 18. Should the persons named in section four (4) of this act, for calling the first village election, be unable to serve from any cause, or should the first election fail for any cause to be called as provided in said section, then the said first election may be called at any time within two (2) years after the passage of this act, by a notice signed by ten (10) of the inhabitants of said village by giving ten (10) days notice of such meeting, and when in meeting assembled the voters of said village may elect any three (3) of their number to act as judges of the election, and the said judges shall do and perform all that is required of the persons named in said section.

SEC. 19. This act shall be a public act and shall be in force from and after its passage; and no law of this state contravening its provisions shall be considered as annulling or modifying the same unless such purpose be expressly set forth in said law.

CHAPTER 44.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE VILLAGE OF TRACY, IN THE COUNTY OF LYON.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the following described territory in the county of Lyon, to-wit: The southwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section number thirteen (13), the south half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of section number fourteen (14), the southeast quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section number fifteen (15), the east half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of section number twenty-two (22), all of section number twenty-three (23), the west half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of section number twenty-four (24), the northwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section number twenty-five (25), the north half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of section number twenty-six (26), and the northeast quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section number twenty-seven (27), be, and the same is hereby set apart for incorporation as the village of Tracy.

SEC. 2. That the following named persons are designated as commissioners under the general laws of this State, to post notices of the first election in said village, viz: M. T. Bohannon, J. M. Wardell, D. Evans, E. O. Brauns and M. D. Gibbs or a majority of them.

SEC. 3. That upon organization as directed in the general laws of this State, the said territory shall constitute the village of Tracy, and shall thereupon be endowed with all the rights, powers, franchises and duties therein prescribed, or to be hereafter prescribed for organized villages in this State.

SEC. 4. Before any incorporation shall be had under this act, the same shall be voted upon and decided by ballot, by a majority of the legal voters of said territory, said election to be called upon notices by said commissioners or a majority of the same, as the election of the officers provided in chapter one hundred and thirty-nine, (139), of the general laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, (1875).

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 45.

A BILL TO SET APART FOR INCORPORATION AS A VILLAGE CERTAIN TERRITORY IN THE COUNTY OF DAKOTA UNDER THE NAME OF THE VILLAGE OF VERMILION.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

SECTION 1. The following described territory in the county of Dakota, in this State, to-wit: The south half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of section fifteen (15) and the north half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of section twenty-two (22) all in township one hundred and fourteen (114) north, of range eighteen (18) west, be and the same is hereby set apart for incorporation as a village in pursuance of the general laws of the State of Minnesota under the name and style of the village of Vermilion.

SEC. 2. That Joseph Larson, Gillis Krusen and Michael Kirst be and hereby are designated to take the requisite steps and do all acts and things necessary to organize the said village under and in pursuance of the said general law.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
