

CHAPTER 54.

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER SIXTY-ONE (61) OF THE SPECIAL LAWS OF EIGHTEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878) AS AMENDED BY CHAPTER THIRTY-FIVE (35) OF SPECIAL LAWS OF EIGHTEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-NINE (1879), RELATING TO THE INCORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF BENSON.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. That section two (2) of chapter sixty-one (61) of the special laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight (1878), as amended by chapter thirty-five (35) of the special laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, be amended by adding thereto, under the head of sub-section seven (7) of said section two (2), enumerating the special powers granted to said village council the following:

Fifth. To appoint a marshal for said village, and to prescribe his duties, term of office and compensation, and to provide and regulate the same.

Sixth. To expend any funds in the hands of said village council for the improvement of the streets of the village, or any highways leading to said village of Benson, whether inside or outside of the corporation limits of said village.

Seventh. To license drays, vehicles and sleds used in draying for hire within the limits of said village of Benson.

SEC. 2. That said section two (2) of chapter sixty-one (61) of the special laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight (1878), be amended by adding at the end thereof the following section:

SEC. 8. All chattel mortgages of personal property situate in, or the owner of which resides in the village of Benson, shall be filed in the office of the village recorder of said village of Benson instead of in the office of the town clerk of the town of Thorning, the same being the town wherein said village is situated, and said filing of said chattel mortgages in the office of such village recorder, after the passage of this act, shall be considered and be a complete compliance with the provisions of section two (2) of chapter thirty-nine of general statutes of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight (1878), as far as property situated within said village is concerned, and have the same force and effect as if the same had been filed in the office of the town clerk in and for the proper town.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
