

CHAPTER 87.

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER TWENTY-FOUR (24) OF THE SPECIAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878). AND ACTS AMENDATORY THEREOF RELATIVE TO THE INCORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF RUSH CITY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section two (2) of chapter two (2) of said act be amended so as to read as follows:

SEC. 2. The elective officers of said village shall be one (1) president, one (1) recorder, three (3) councilors, one (1) treasurer and two (2) justices of the peace, and each shall, except the justices of the peace and councilors hold their respective offices for the term of one (1) year, and until their successors are elected and qualified; the justices of the peace shall be styled village justices and shall hold their office for the term of two years and until their successors are elected and qualified, the councilors shall each hold his office for the term of three (3) years and until his successor is elected and qualified. At the next village election in said village, to be held on the fifteenth (15th) day of April, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one (1881), three (3) councilors shall be elected, one (1) to hold his office for the term of one (1) year, one (1) to hold his office for the term of two (2) years, and one (1) to hold his office for the term of three (3) years, and at each general election thereafter one (1) councilor shall be elected each year.

The ballot used at the election on the fifth (5th) day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one (1881), aforesaid; shall contain the term of office for which each councilor is to be elected.

SEC. 3. That section three (3) of chapter thirty-one (31) of special laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, (1879) relative to the incorporation of the village of Rush City, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 88.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF RUSHFORD.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That article six (6) of chapter two (2) of the Special

Laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine (1869) be amended by adding thereto the following section :

Section 8. The council shall have power to levy a special tax in addition to any hereinbefore mentioned upon all the taxable property in the city, and use the money derived from such tax in maintaining roads and bridges outside of the limits of said city. *Provided*, that said tax shall not in any one year exceed two (2) mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of said taxable property.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect on and after its passage.

CHAPTER 89.

AN ACT TO AMEND AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE VILLAGE OF SAUK CENTRE.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section 2 of chapter 16 of the special laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-six (1876) be amended by adding to said section as follows:

The village council of said village shall have power to elect a village marshal, who shall have the same power of arrest as a constable under the general law, and said council may appoint special police when they deem it necessary for the preservation of good order, who shall have the same general power of arrest during the time of their appointment as constables under the general law. The marshal and special policemen shall have such compensation for their services as may be fixed by the council, and shall execute such orders and perform such duties as are prescribed by the village council for the collection of licenses and fines and for the preservation of the public peace.

SEC. 2. All and every process or notice against said village of Sauk Centre shall be served upon the president of the council and in his absence upon any trustee of said village or the recorder.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
