

CHAPTER 96.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION ONE (1) OF CHAPTER ONE (1) OF THE SPECIAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN (1877), AND TO REPEAL CHAPTER SIXTY-TWO (62) OF THE SPECIAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-EIGHT (1878), RELATING TO THE INCORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF WATERTOWN, CARVER COUNTY, MINNESOTA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That chapter sixty-two (62) of the Special Laws of the year A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight (1878), relating to the incorporation of the village of Watertown, Carver county, Minnesota, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. That section one (1) of chapter one (1) of the Special Laws of the year A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven (1877), be, and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following provisos, to-wit:

Provided, that the provisions of section sixteen (16) of chapter one hundred and thirty-nine (139) of the General Laws of the year A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five (1875), shall not apply to the said village of Watertown; *and, provided, further*, that the territory comprising the said village of Watertown, and the inhabitants thereof, shall, for the purposes of taxation, and all general and special elections, and for the maintainance and support of roads and bridges, and all other purposes, remain and be a part of the town of Watertown, as organized before the organization of said village of Watertown, and that all legal voters of the State of Minnesota, who may reside in said village, shall be deemed to be inhabitants, tax payers and legal voters of said town of Watertown.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
