CHAPTER 103.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR THE USE OF THE "FARMERS BOARD OF TRADE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of one thousand (\$1,000) dollars, or so much thereof as shall be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, for the use of the Farmers' Board of Trade of the State of Minnesota, to be expended by them pursuant to the provisions of chapter ninety-nine (99) of the General Laws of A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine (1879.)

SEC. 2. The money hereby appropriated shall remain in

the Treasury subject to the order of said Board.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 104.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR THE LEGISLATIVE EXPENSES FOR THE PRESENT SESSION OF THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated twenty thousand (20,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, from the general revenue fund, for the payment of per diem, mileage, and other expenses of the members and officers of the Legislature during the present session.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
