

CHAPTER 229.

AN ACT TO REPEAL CHAPTER THREE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE (389) OF THE SPECIAL LAWS OF ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE (1881), AN ACT ENTITLED, AN ACT TO PROVIDE A SINKING FUND FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE BONDED INDEBTEDNESS OF THE CITY OF ALBERT LEA, MINNESOTA.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That chapter three hundred and eighty-nine (389) of the special laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one (1881), being an act entitled; "An act to provide a sinking fund for the payment of the bonded indebtedness of the city of Albert Lea, Minnesota," be, and the same is hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. Before this act shall take effect, the same shall be submitted to a vote of the electors of said city at the general annual election, November eighth (8th), one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one (1881), notice thereof to be given in such form and manner as the common council of said city may prescribe. At such election all persons voting in favor of the provisions of this act shall have printed or written or partly printed and written on their ballots, the words: "For repeal of sinking fund act," and those voting against the provisions of this act, the words: "Against repeal of sinking fund act." The return of such votes shall be made and certified to, canvassed and result thereof declared in the manner provided by the charter of said city for returning, certifying, and canvassing votes at city elections. If a majority of the electors of said city, present and voting upon this question at such election, shall vote "For repeal of sinking fund act," then, and in that case this act shall be in full force and effect, but not otherwise.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
