

CHAPTER 86.

AN ACT FOR AN ACT TO LEGALIZE THE ORGANIZATION OF LAKE COUNTY, AND THE OFFICIAL ACTS OF THE OFFICERS THEREOF.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

County organization and acts of county of ficers legalized

SECTION 1. That the county organization heretofore existing de facto in the county of Lake, since the appointment by the Governor of commissioners for said county on the tenth (10th) day of May, A. D. eighteen hundred and sixty-six (1866), be, and the same is hereby legalized, and the said county is hereby declared to be, and to have been ever since the said May tenth (10th), [A. D.] eighteen hundred and sixty-six (1866), a duly organized county. All the official acts of persons purporting to act as the officers of said county since said May tenth (10th), A. D. eighteen hundred and sixty-six (1866), are hereby declared to be of the same validity and force as though the county aforesaid had been declared a duly organized county, and such appointment of commissioners duly authorized by act of the legislature passed prior to the date of such appointment, and all persons now acting as officers of such county shall continue to occupy their respective offices, and to perform the duties thereof in like manner for the like periods respectively, and with the same effect, as though their several elections or appointments had been duly authorized by law.

Present officers to continue

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage; but shall not affect any previous legislative recognition of the organization of said county.
