CHAPTER 213.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY TO AID IN THE BUILDING OF A BRIDGE ACROSS THE LONG PRAIRIE RIVER, IN THE COUNTY OF TODD.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any moneys now or hereafter in the internal improvement fund, not otherwise appropriated, to aid the county of Todd in building a bridge across the Long Prairie river, in section twenty-four (24), in township one hundred and thirty-three (133), north of range thirty-two (32), west of the fifth (5) principal meridian.

SEC. 2. That the following named citizens of said county are hereby appointed commissioners to view the said bridge and report the completion thereof to the state treasurer, namely: H. B. Morrison, James Whitford of Motley, Morrison county, and J. H. Dean of Hartford, Todd county, and upon receiving a certificate of the completion and acceptance of such bridge, signed by said commissioners and countersigned by the auditor of said Todd county, the state treasurer shall pay the money hereby appropriated to the treasurer of said county, to be by him applied under the direction of the county commissioners of said county, in defraying the expenses of the construction of said bridge.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
