

CHAPTER 304.

AN ACT ALLOWING CITIZENS OF BEN WADE AND RENO TO LOWER THE WATER OF CERTAIN LAKES IN POPE COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

SECTION 1. John E. Benson and other citizens in the towns of Ben Wade and Reno, owning lands upon the shores of the lakes called Diamond Lake and Horse Lake, in the county of Pope, is hereby permitted to lower the waters of said lakes, through the natural outlets of the same, for the purpose of utilizing said streams for mill power purposes; *Provided*, That the water in said lakes shall never be lowered more than two (2) feet below, nor ever be made to rise above, their present high water marks; *Provided further*, That before lowering the waters of said lakes, consent in writing be obtained of the parties owning lands upon the shores of said lakes, and filed in the office of the register of deeds of the county of Pope.

SEC. 2. In case any person refuse consent to the proposed draining, the damages, if any, may be appraised as provided by the general statutes.

SEC. 3. That this act shall be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 305.

AN ACT TO CHANGE THE NAME OF THE RED WING FURNITURE FACTORY.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the name of the corporation known as the Red Wing Furniture Factory, be, and the same is hereby changed to that of the Red Wing Furniture Company.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
