

GENERAL LAWS
OF
MINNESOTA

PASSED AND APPROVED DURING THE THIRTY-
FOURTH SESSION OF THE LEGISLATURE
COMMENCING JANUARY THIRD, 1905.

CHAPTER 1.

An act to appropriate money for the expenses of the session of the State Legislature for the year nineteen hundred five (1905). S. F. No. 1.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand (\$150,000) dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of paying the expenses of the session of the state legislature for the year nineteen hundred and five (1905). Appropriation.
Legislative expense.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved Jan. 5, 1905.

CHAPTER 2.

An act to provide for the printing and binding of additional copies of the Revised Laws, prepared by the revision commission and to appropriate money therefor. H. F. No. 39.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. The commission to revise, codify and annotate the public statutes of this state, appointed by virtue of chapter 241 of the General Laws of 1901, is Printing code.

Extra copies.

hereby directed to have printed and bound, in manila covers, one thousand (1,000) extra copies of the statutes revised and codified by it, without the index, immediately, and to deliver the same to the secretary of state, to be distributed, as directed by the justices of the supreme court, in the manner already provided in section one (1) of said chapter 241, of the General Laws of 1901.

Appropriation.

SEC. 2. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary to carry out the direction contained in said section one (1), for the printing of said additional copies.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from any after its passage.

CHAPTER 3.

H. F. No. 11.

An act legalizing the acts of cities and villages in the annexation of additional territory or enlarging their boundaries when framing and adopting their charters, pursuant to section 36, article 4, of the Constitution, and chapter 351 of the Laws of Minnesota for the year 1899.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Legalizing annexation of territory.

SECTION 1. That the annexation of any additional territory or enlargement of boundaries by any city or village in this state heretofore made, between Jan. 1st, 1903, and April 15th, 1903, in framing and adopting its charter, under and pursuant to the provisions of section 36, article 4, of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, and chapter 351 of the Laws of Minnesota for the year 1899, be and the same are hereby in all things legalized and confirmed;

Provided, that the provisions of this act shall not extend or apply to any action or proceeding now pending.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
