CHAPTER 221.

Mileage
books.

An act providing that certain mileage books or tickets issued by railroad companies shall be transferable.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- SECTION 1. All passenger mileage tickets or books hereafter issued by railroad companies operating lines in this state, except interchangeable mileage now in use, shall be good until used, and shall be transferable by delivery and good for travel in the hands of the holder thereof between stations in Minnesota.

SEC. 2. Railroad companies accepting such mileage tickets shall not be liable to the owner of such ticket in case they are used by persons not legally entitled to use the same.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1st, 1905.

CHAPTER 222.

An act to amend section 3 of chapter 148 of the General Laws of 1887 as amended by section 1 of chapter 166 of the General Laws of 1899, permitting the admission of wives, widows and mothers of soldiers to the Soldiers' Home.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- SECTION 1. That section three (3) of chapter one hundred and forty-eight (148) of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven (1887) as amended by section one (1) of chapter one hundred sixty-six (166) of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred ninety-nine (1899) be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 3. The object of the Soldiers' Home shall be to provide a home for all honorably discharged ex-soldiers, sailors and marines, who served in the army or navy of the United States during the War of the Rebellion, or the Mexican war, or in the war begun in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight (1898) between the kingdom of Spain and the United States, who now are or may hereafter become citizens of the
