

CHAPTER 260.

S. F. No. 431.

An act to amend section 3, chapter 333, of the General Laws of the State of Minnesota for the year 1903, entitled "An act fixing and regulating the collection and disposition of fees of clerks of the district court in counties having or which hereafter may have a population of 200,000 inhabitants or over."

Fees of clerks of dist. court in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section 3 of chapter 333 of the General Laws of the State of Minnesota for the year 1903, entitled "An act fixing and regulating the collection and disposition of fees of clerks of the district court in counties having or which hereafter may have a population of 200,000 inhabitants or over," be amended so as to read as follows: When any such action or proceeding is dismissed by either party no further fee shall be paid, but on the continuance of the same to a succeeding general term, at the request of either party, a further fee of twenty-five cents shall be paid by the party requesting said continuance.

Amendment.

SEC. 2. That all acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 261.

S. F. No. 460.

An act to legalize newspapers in certain cases.

Legalizing newspapers.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. No newspaper in this state, which conforms in all respects to the statutes defining a legal newspaper, except that it was not published for two consecutive weeks at some time since it became a legal newspaper, shall be deprived of its standing as such legal newspaper by reason of such omission; but such newspaper shall be deemed to be a legal newspaper notwithstanding such omission of its publication for two (2) consecutive weeks.

Failure to publish consecutively.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
