

not exceeding nine hundred (\$900) dollars per year, to be paid in like manner as the salary of the judge.

SEC. 2. This act shall only apply to counties of more than 35,000 inhabitants.

SEC. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 82.

Preservation
of forests.

An act to amend section 8 of chapter 363 of the General Laws of Minnesota, 1903, entitled "An act to amend an act entitled an act to provide for the preservation of forests of this state and for the prevention and suppression of forest and prairie fires."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section eight (8) of chapter three hundred and sixty-three (363) of the General Laws of 1903, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Pay of fire
wardens.

Section 8. Each fire warden shall be paid for actual service at the rate of two (\$2) dollars per day, and each employe or patrol at the rate of one and fifty one-hundredths (\$1.50) dollars per day. Unless directed by the chief fire warden no fire warden shall be paid for more than fifteen (15) and no employe for more than ten (10) days in any one year; but a fire warden shall receive compensation for use of team when plowing for the control of a fire. The compensation authorized by this section shall be paid out of the state treasury on duly verified vouchers approved by the chief fire warden; and one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) the amount shall be reimbursed to the state by the county in which the expense occurred. The state auditor shall notify the proper county auditor of the one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) the amount that has become due from his county under the foregoing provisions and such county auditor shall immediately draw and transmit to the state auditor a warrant on the county treasurer of his county in favor of the state for such amount.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
