CHAPTER 347.

H. F. No. 2.

A Memorial from the Legislature of the State of Minnesota, to the Congress of the United States, for the early enactment of a law, giving the Interstate Commerce Commission, enlarged and adequate powers to regulate railroad rates.

Resolved, By the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota, the Senate thereof concurring, that the Congress of the United States, be and is hereby respectfully urged to enact into law, as speedily as practicable, authority to the Interstate Commerce Commission, to adequately and effectively regulate railroad rates, and to enforce such reasonable rates as it may fix.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State be and is hereby requested to forthwith transmit certified copies of this memorial to the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Congress, and to send copies to each of the Senators and Representatives therein from this state.
