

CHAPTER 268—H. F. No. 293.

An Act providing for the payment by counties for physicians' services and other necessary expenses in cases where the same becomes necessary because of physical injury received by any peace officer of this state while in the discharge of his official duties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Counties to reimburse peace officers for certain bills incurred.

—Section 1. Whenever any sheriff, deputy sheriff, constable or other peace officer of this state shall hereafter receive physical injury, while in the discharge of his official duty as such peace officer, the county board, wherein such officer resides, may audit and allow bills for physicians' services, nurse and hospital expenses rendered necessary because of such injury and may appropriate money out of the revenue fund of the county for payment thereof.

CHAPTER 269—H. F. No. 323.

An Act legalizing proceedings had under chapter seven (7) Revised Laws of 1905 relative to the organization of new counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Counties and acts of officials legalized.—Section 1. That all counties in this state heretofore organized or attempted to be organized under chapter seven (7), Revised Laws of 1905, and now exercising the powers of bodies corporate, are hereby legalized as counties with all the rights, powers and privileges conferred upon counties within the State of Minnesota, with their boundaries and now actually organized, and all acts performed by any officer or officers of such counties within the scope of the laws of this state are hereby legalized. *Provided*, that nothing herein contained shall in any way affect any action or proceeding now pending.
