vacancies in positions which occur due to termination during the probationary period.

Sec. 65. COMMISSARY AND QUARTERS ALLOW-ANCE. No commissary privileges, including food, laundry service, and household supplies, shall be furnished to any officer or employee living in staff residences or apartments at the State Training School for Boys and the Home School for Girls out of appropriations made by this act.

To the Superintendents of the State Training School for Boys and the Home School for Girls, the Commissioner of Corrections, if there be one, or the Chairman of the Youth Conservation Commission, is authorized to pay out of the salary appropriations for these institutions, a maintenance allowance of not to exceed \$175.00 per month.

- Sec. 66. LIMITATIONS ON APPROPRIATIONS. All the foregoing appropriations herein contained are to be expended subject to the provisions of Laws 1939, Chapter 431. No appropriation shall become available for expenditure until such estimates as required by Section 16, Article II, of such act shall have been approved by the commissioner of administration. No obligation involving expenditure of money shall be entered into unless there is a balance in the appropriation available not otherwise encumbered to pay obligations previously incurred.
- Sec. 67. FURNITURE PURCHASES FROM STATE REFORMATORY. Provided, insofar as practicable, all furniture to be purchased by state departments from moneys made available in this act, shall be procured from the State Reformatory for Men, notwithstanding any other provisions to the contrary.
- Sec. 68. None of the moneys appropriated by this act or any other law shall be expended in making any refund where the amount thereof is \$1.00 or less.

CHAPTER 62—S. F. No. 176

An act to authorize the Village of Kimball Prairie to issue general obligation bonds to fund debt heretofore incurred for a street improvement.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. General obligation bonds. The village council of the village of Kimball Prairie is hereby authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds of the village in the amount of not to exceed \$35,000 for the purpose of providing money to pay for improvements in village streets. Such bonds shall mature in such years, bear such rate or rates of interest, and be sold in such manner as the village council shall by resolution determine.
- Sec. 2. The proceeds of such bonds shall be used solely to pay for curb, gutter, surfacing, and other improvements in the village streets pursuant to contracts heretofore entered into by the village council and all such contracts are hereby legalized and validated.
- Sec. 3. This act shall not apply to or affect any action or appeal now pending in which such bonds shall be called in question.
- Sec. 4. This law takes effect when approved by the village council of the village of Kimball Prairie and upon compliance with Laws 1959, Chapter 368.

An act relating to planning and zoning in Mower County; amending Laws 1959, Chapter 101, Section 2, Subdivision 1.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Laws 1959, Chapter 101, Section 2, Subdivision 1, is amended to read:

Sec. 2. Subdivision 1. Mower County, planning and zoning. The county board shall establish a planning commission of from 5 to 15 members appointed by the county board for such terms as the county board shall designate.

The members of the planning commission shall receive such compensation together with such necessary mileage and expenses in attending meetings while on the business of the commission, as shall be determined by the county board. The
