

administration. The state board shall adopt internal procedures to administer and monitor aids and grants.

Sec. 9. ADOPTED EMERGENCY RULES.

The emergency rules promulgated pursuant to Laws 1984, chapter 654, article 4, section 3, and adopted by the higher education coordinating board on March 21, 1985, are effective April 29, 1985, without further administrative action. Students may borrow retroactively under these rules to cover educational expenses incurred during the 1984-1985 academic year. These emergency rules shall expire on the date that emergency rules adopted by the board under the administrative procedure act are effective or on June 30, 1985, whichever occurs first.

Sec. 10. REVISOR REQUEST.

The revisor of statutes is requested to change the heading of Minnesota Statutes, section 136C.26, to read "VOCATIONAL AID DEFINITIONS."

Sec. 11. REPEALER.

Minnesota Statutes 1984, sections 125.055 and 136C.27, subdivision 1, are repealed.

Sec. 12. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This act is effective July 1, 1985.

CHAPTER 123 — H.F.No. 683

An act relating to probate; allowing a minor to be a donor for purposes of the Uniform Anatomical Gift Act; amending Minnesota Statutes 1984, sections 525.922, subdivision 1; and 525.924, by adding a subdivision.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1984, section 525.922, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

Subdivision 1. Any individual of sound mind and 18 years of age or more, or any minor, with written consent of both parents, a legal guardian, or the parent or parents with legal custody may give all or any part of his the individual's body for any purpose specified in section 525.923, the gift to take effect upon death.

Changes or additions are indicated by underline, deletions by ~~strikeout~~.

Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 1984, section 525.924, is amended by adding a subdivision to read:

Subd. 2a. A gift of all or part of the body under section 525.922, subdivision 1, may be made by a minor, in a document other than a will. The gift becomes effective upon the death of the donor. The document, which may be a card designed to be carried on the person, must: (1) be signed by the minor donor and both of the minor donor's parents, a legal guardian, or the parent or parents with legal custody; (2) give the minor donor's date of birth; (3) give the address of the minor donor; and (4) contain the following words: "In hope that I may help others to live, I hereby make this anatomical gift, if medically acceptable, to take effect upon my death. I give (organ name) for the purpose of transplantation." If the minor cannot sign, the card may not be signed for the minor. Delivery of the gift document during the minor donor's lifetime is not necessary to make the gift valid.

CHAPTER 124 — H.F.No. 1152

An act relating to Winona county; authorizing the sale of certain property.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. WINONA COUNTY; SALE OF CERTAIN PROPERTY.

Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, sections 161.44, subdivision 1, and 373.01, subdivision 1, or any other law to the contrary, the county board of Winona county may convey, for the appraised value, to a private person by private sale free of any public purposes requirement or limitation the building known as the Winona County Humane Society Shelter and the land on which it is located containing 1.18 acres, more or less, described as: All that part of Government Lots 4 and 5 of Section 18, Township 107 North, Range 7 West, as located by: Commencing at the Northeast Corner of Section 19, Township 107 North, Range 7 West of the Fifth Principal Meridian; thence proceeding South along the East line of Section 19 for 1595.20 feet to the centerline of Trunk Highway #61; thence deflect to the right 120 degrees 33 minutes 46 seconds along the centerline of Trunk Highway #61 for 4293.60 feet; thence deflect to the left on a 00 degree 30 minutes 00 seconds circular curve (delta angle 6 degrees 11 minutes 00 seconds) radius 11459.16 feet for 289.70 feet; thence deflect left at right angles to the tangent of said 00 degree 30 minutes 00 seconds curve at said point for 75.00 feet to the southerly right of way line of Trunk Highway #61, and the point of beginning; thence proceeding on the last described course for 117.00 feet to the Gilmore Valley Flowage right of way; thence deflect right 94

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
