The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Mining and Outdoor Recreation Policy

1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to state lands; authorizing public sale of certain tax-forfeited land that
1.3 borders public water.

1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5 Section 1. **PUBLIC SALE OF TAX-FORFEITED LAND BORDERING PUBLIC**
1.6 **WATER; LAKE COUNTY.**

1.7 (a) Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, sections 92.45 and 282.018, subdivision 1,
1.8 Lake County may sell the tax-forfeited land bordering public water that is described in
1.9 paragraph (c) under the remaining provisions of Minnesota Statutes, chapter 282.

1.10 (b) The conveyance must be in a form approved by the attorney general. The attorney
1.11 general may make changes to the land description to correct errors and ensure accuracy.

1.12 (c) The land to be sold is located in Lake County and is described as:

1.13 (1) an undivided interest in the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter, Section
1.14 7, Township 63, Range 9 (parcel number 28-6309-07020);

1.15 (2) an undivided interest in the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter, Section
1.16 7, Township 63, Range 9 (parcel number 28-6309-07140);

1.17 (3) an undivided interest in the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter, Section
1.18 8, Township 63, Range 9 (parcel number 28-6309-08285);

1.19 (4) an undivided interest in the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter, Section
1.20 8, Township 63, Range 9 (parcel number 28-6309-08345);

1.21 (5) the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter, Section 1, Township 53, Range
1.22 10 (parcel number 29-5310-01070); and

1.23 (6) the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter, Section 1, Township 53, Range
1.24 10 (parcel number 29-5310-01250).

- 2.1 (d) The county has determined that the county's land management interests would
- 2.2 best be served if the lands were returned to private ownership.
