1.9	(b) "Person" means: (1) an individual, association, for-profit or nonprofit entity, religious
1.10	organization, or charitable organization and the individual, association, for-profit or nonprofit

1.13	(c) "Government guidance" means policies, procedures, regulations, or executive orders
