1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. [160.99] GENERAL PURPOSE LANES.
1.6	(a) A road authority, including the governing body of a city, may not convert,
1.7	transfer, or utilize a general purpose lane on a street or highway:
1.8	(1) for use in intercity passenger rail, commuter rail, or light rail transit; or
1.9	(2) exclusively for one or more of the following: bicyclists, pedestrians, bus rapid
1.10	transit including arterial bus rapid transit, express buses, streetcars, or high-occupancy
1.11	vehicles.
1.12	(b) This section does not apply to a shoulder, as defined in section 169.011,
1.13	subdivision 74, converted to a dynamic shoulder lane that operates as a general purpose
1.14	lane during certain periods.
