1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. [60A.181] INVOLUNTARY TERMINATION OF AGENT;
1.7	ENFORCEABILITY OF CERTAIN RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS.
1.8	A covenant or agreement entered into by an insurer and an agent is void and
1.9	unenforceable if:
1.10	(1) the agent was involuntarily terminated by the insurer; and
1.11	(2) the covenant or agreement prohibits one or both of the following activities:
1.12	(i) working in a specific geographic area for a specific period of time after the cancellation
1.13	or termination of the agency contract; or
1.14	(ii) soliciting employees of the insurer or soliciting or transacting business with customers
1.15	of the insurer.
1.16	EFFECTIVE DATE; APPLICATION. This section is effective the day following
1.17	final enactment and applies to a covenant or agreement in effect on, or entered into on or
1.18	after, that date.
