1.11	Section 1. Every person 18 years of age or more who has been a citizen of the United

States for three months and who has resided in the precinct for 30 days next preceding an 1.12 election shall be entitled to vote in that precinct. In addition, every person 18 years of age 1.13 or more who has been a citizen of the United States and resident of this state for three 1.14 months and who is the owner of agricultural land or nonhomesteaded, noncommercial 1.15 real property or who is the owner of commercial or industrial real property and conducts 1 16 on the property a small business as defined by law may vote in the precinct where the 1.17 real property is located on any question concerning local levies or referendums. The 1.18 place of voting by one otherwise qualified who has changed his residence within 30 days 1.19 preceding the election shall be prescribed by law.
