\$8,500,000 is appropriated from the bond proceeds fund to the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board to predesign, design, engineer, construct, and complete preservation and renovation of a facility that provides educational and cultural experiences to students, tourists, and Minnesota residents in the city of Minneapolis that is open to the public in conjunction with a private nonprofit institution located on park board land on the site of the old parade grounds, subject to Minnesota Statutes, section 16A.695. The preservation and renovation will include infrastructure replacement or repair, increased physical accessibility to meet the Americans with Disabilities Act, and increasing energy efficiency of related facilities.

Sec. 2. **BOND SALE.**

To provide the money appropriated in section 1 from the bond proceeds fund, the 1.18 commissioner of management and budget shall sell and issue bonds of the state in an 1.19 amount up to \$8,500,000 in the manner, upon the terms, and with the effect prescribed by 1.20 Minnesota Statutes, sections 16A.631 to 16A.675, and by the Minnesota Constitution, 1.21 article XI, sections 4 to 7. 1.22
