1.15	Subd. 1a. Counties with a population that does not exceed 600,000. For
1.16	counties whose population does not exceed 600,000, the county board shall have the
1.17	official proceedings of its sessions, or a summary of its proceedings as authorized under
1.18	subdivision 1, published in a qualified newspaper of general circulation in the county. The
1.19	publication shall be let annually by contract to the lowest bidder, at the first regular session
1.20	of the board in January each year. If the county board determines that publication of a

50,000, and is less than 250,000, the proceedings may be published in one daily and one	
weekly newspaper at the county seat. If the official newspaper of the county ceases to	
exist for any reason except consolidation with another newspaper, the county board may	
designate another newspaper for the remainder of the year. The publication shall occur	
within 30 days of the meeting to which the proceedings relate.	
Subd. 1b. Counties with a population exceeding 600,000. For counties whose	
population exceeds 600,000, the county board shall have the official proceedings of its	
sessions, or a summary of its proceedings as authorized under subdivision 1, published	
in either:	
(1) a daily qualified newspaper of general circulation in the county in compliance	
with subdivision 1a; or	
(2) on the county's Web site if the following conditions are met:	
(i) the county's home page displays a link to official proceedings;	
(ii) minutes of county board proceedings are kept for at least one year on the Web	
site; and	
(iii) official notices remain on the Web site during the notice's full publication period.	
Subd. 2. Small claims totaled. Individualized itemized accounts, claims or	
demands allowed by the county board pursuant to section 471.38, subdivision 1, need not	
be published pursuant to subdivision 1, if the amount allowed from each claim is \$2,000	
or less. The official proceedings following the itemization of accounts required shall	

contain a statement showing the total number of claims that did not exceed \$2,000 and
