1.1 A bill for an act

1.2 relating to corrections; providing reimbursement of certain transportation expenses

1.3 incurred by counties under the Interstate Compact for Adult Supervision; proposing

1.4 coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 243.

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. **[243.1609] INTERSTATE ADULT OFFENDER TRANSFER**

1.7 **TRANSPORTATION EXPENSES.**

1.8 Beginning in fiscal year 2023, up to \$250,000 each year is appropriated to the

1.9 commissioner of corrections for reimbursement of transportation expenses related to the

1.10 return of probationers to the state who are being held in custody under section 243.1605.

1.11 Reimbursement shall be based on a fee schedule agreed to by the Department of Corrections

1.12 and the Minnesota Sheriffs' Association. The required return to the state of a probationer

1.13 in custody as a result of a nationwide warrant issued pursuant to the Interstate Compact for

1.14 Adult Supervision shall be arranged and supervised by the sheriff of the county in which

1.15 the court proceedings are to be held and at the expense of the state as provided for in this

1.16 section. This expense offset is not applicable to the transport of individuals from pickup

1.17 locations within 250 miles of the office of the sheriff arranging and supervising the offender's

1.18 return to the state.
