The commissioner must investigate 1.9 the criminal history background of any driver's license agent and any current or prospective 1.10 employees of the department or driver's license agent being considered for any position that 1.11 has or will have the ability to: 1.12 (1) create or modify records of applicants for identification cards and driver's licenses, 1.13 1.14 including REAL ID compliant driver's licenses, REAL ID compliant identification cards, enhanced driver's licenses, and enhanced identification cards; 1.15 (2) issue enhanced driver's licenses or enhanced identification cards; or 1.16 (3) administer knowledge or skills tests under section 171.13 to an applicant for a 1.17 commercial driver's license. 1.18

- 2.5 (1) a home utility services bill issued no more than 90 days 12 months before the application, provided that the commissioner must not accept a United States home utility 2.6
- bill if two unrelated people are listed on the bill; 2.7
- (2) a home utility services hook-up work order issued no more than 90 days 12 months 2.8 before the application, provided that the commissioner must not accept a home utility 2.9 services hook-up work order if two unrelated people are listed on the work order; 2.10
 - (3) United States bank or financial information issued no more than 90 days 12 months before the application, with account numbers redacted, including:
- (i) a bank account statement; 2.13
- (ii) a canceled check; or 2.14

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- (iii) (ii) a credit card or debit card statement; 2.15
- (iii) a brokerage account statement; or 2.16
- (iv) a money market account statement; 2.17
- (4) a United States high school identification card with a certified transcript from the 2.18 school, if issued no more than 180 days before the application; 2.19
- (5) a Minnesota college or university identification card with a certified transcript from 2.20 the college or university, if issued no more than 180 days before the application; 2.21
- (6) an employment pay stub issued no more than 90 days 12 months before the application 2.22 that lists the employer's name, and address, and telephone number; 2.23
- (7) a Minnesota unemployment insurance benefit statement issued no more than 90 days 2.24 12 months before the application; 2.25
- (8) a statement from a housing with services building registered under chapter 144D, 2.26 nursing home licensed under chapter 144A, or a boarding care facility licensed under sections 2.27 144.50 to 144.56, that was issued no more than 90 days 12 months before the application; 2.28
- (9) a life, current policy or card for health, automobile, homeowner's, or renter's insurance policy issued no more than 90 days before the application, provided that the commissioner 2.30 must not accept a proof of insurance card;
