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relating to public safety; adding criminal vehicular operation to list of offenses requiring a one-year waiting period for a limited driver's license; removing requirement that invalidated licenses be physically clipped; renaming two-wheeled vehicle endorsements to motorcycle endorsements; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 169.224, subdivision 3; 169.974, subdivision 2; 169A.52, subdivision 7; 171.06, subdivision 2a; 171.13, subdivision 6; 171.30, subdivisions 2a, 5; Minnesota Statutes 2023 Supplement, section 171.13, subdivision 1a.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
- Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 169.224, subdivision 3, is amended to read: 1.10
- Subd. 3. **Operation.** (a) A neighborhood electric vehicle or a medium-speed electric 1.11 vehicle may not be operated on a street or highway with a speed limit greater than 35 miles 1.12 per hour, except to make a direct crossing of that street or highway. 1.13
- (b) A person may operate a three-wheeled neighborhood electric vehicle without a 1.14 two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle endorsement, provided the person has a valid driver's 1.15 license issued under chapter 171. 1.16
- Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 169.974, subdivision 2, is amended to read: 1.17
- Subd. 2. License endorsement and permit requirements. (a) No person shall operate 1.18 a motorcycle on any street or highway without having a valid driver's license with a 1.19 two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle endorsement as provided by law. A person may operate 1.20 an autocycle without a two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle endorsement, provided the person 1.21 has a valid driver's license issued under section 171.02. 1.22

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(b) The commissioner of public safety shall issue a two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle
endorsement only if the applicant (1) has in possession a valid two-wheeled vehicle
motorcycle instruction permit as provided in paragraph (c), (2) has passed a written
examination and road test administered by the Department of Public Safety for the
endorsement, and (3) in the case of applicants under 18 years of age, presents a certificate
or other evidence of having successfully completed an approved two-wheeled vehicle
motorcycle driver's safety course in this or another state, in accordance with rules adopted
by the commissioner of public safety for courses offered by a public, private, or commercial
school or institute. The commissioner of public safety may waive the road test for any
applicant on determining that the applicant possesses a valid license to operate a two-wheeled
vehicle motorcycle issued by a jurisdiction that requires a comparable road test for license
issuance.

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- (c) The commissioner of public safety shall issue a two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle instruction permit to any person over 16 years of age who (1) is in possession of a valid driver's license, (2) is enrolled in an approved two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle driver's safety course, and (3) has passed a written examination for the permit and paid a fee prescribed by the commissioner of public safety. A two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle instruction permit is effective for one year and may be renewed under rules prescribed by the commissioner of public safety.
- (d) No person who is operating by virtue of a two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle instruction permit shall:
- (1) carry any passengers on the streets and highways of this state on the motorcycle while the person is operating the motorcycle;
- (2) drive the motorcycle at night; or
- (3) drive the motorcycle without wearing protective headgear that complies with standards 2.25 established by the commissioner of public safety. 2.26
 - (e) Notwithstanding paragraphs (a) to (d), the commissioner of public safety may issue a special motorcycle permit, restricted or qualified as the commissioner of public safety deems proper, to any person demonstrating a need for the permit and unable to qualify for a driver's license.

 - Subd. 7. **Test refusal**; driving privilege lost. (a) On behalf of the commissioner, a peace officer requiring a test or directing the administration of a chemical test shall serve immediate

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notice of intention to revoke and of revocation on a person who refuses to permit a test or on a person who submits to a test the results of which indicate an alcohol concentration of 0.08 or more.

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- (b) On behalf of the commissioner, a peace officer requiring a test or directing the administration of a chemical test of a person driving, operating, or in physical control of a commercial motor vehicle shall serve immediate notice of intention to disqualify and of disqualification on a person who refuses to permit a test, or on a person who submits to a test the results of which indicate an alcohol concentration of 0.04 or more.
 - (c) The officer shall:
- (1) invalidate the person's driver's license or permit card by clipping the upper corner of the card in such a way that no identifying information including the photo is destroyed, and immediately return the card to the person;
 - (2) issue the person a temporary license effective for only seven days; and
- (3) send the notification of this action to the commissioner along with the certificate 3.14 required by subdivision 3 or 4. 3.15

- Subd. 2a. Two-wheeled vehicle Motorcycle endorsement fee. (a) In addition to the 3.17 appropriate fee under subdivision 2, the fee for a two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle 3.18 endorsement on a driver's license is: 3.19
 - (1) \$26.50 for an initial endorsement or a duplicate license obtained for the purpose of adding the endorsement; and
- (2) \$17 for each license renewal with the endorsement. 3.22
- (b) The additional fee must be paid into the state treasury and credited as follows: 3.23
- (1) \$19 of the additional fee under paragraph (a), clause (1), and \$11 of the additional 3.24 fee under paragraph (a), clause (2), to the motorcycle safety fund, which is hereby created; 3.25 and 3.26
- (2) the remainder to the general fund. 3.27
- (c) All application forms prepared by the commissioner for two-wheeled vehicle 3.28 motorcycle endorsements must clearly state the amount of the total fee that is dedicated to 3.29 the motorcycle safety fund. 3.30

- (b) If the commissioner determines that an applicant for a two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle endorsement is 21 years of age or older and possesses a valid driver's license with a two-wheeled vehicle motorcycle endorsement issued by another state or jurisdiction that requires a comparable examination to obtain an endorsement, the commissioner must waive the requirements with respect to the endorsement that the applicant pass a knowledge examination and demonstrate the ability to exercise ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a motor vehicle.
- (c) For purposes of this subdivision, "jurisdiction" includes, but is not limited to, both the active and reserve components of any branch or unit of the United States armed forces, and "valid driver's license" includes any driver's license that is recognized by that branch or unit as currently being valid, or as having been valid at the time of the applicant's separation or discharge from the military within a period of time deemed reasonable and fair by the commissioner, up to and including one year past the date of the applicant's separation or discharge.
