The commissioner has the sole regulatory authority over the terrestrial application of pesticides. Subd. 11. Aquatic application of pesticides. (a) The agency may issue National

(b) The agency shall not regulate or require permits for the terrestrial application

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for aquatic pesticide applications beyond what is required by federal law or rule.
