4505 0300 LATE FILING FEES

4505.0300 LATE FILING FEES.

The board shall send a delinquency notice by certified mail to a public official or candidate within ten business days after a filing date. A certified letter returned by the post office to the board as refused is considered received by the addressee on the date refused. The late filing fee begins accumulating on the eighth day after refusal. A certified letter returned to the board as undelivered or refused must be forwarded by first class mail to the public official or candidate. An undelivered notice of late filing is considered received by the recipient five business days after the first class mailing. A late filing fee must be charged through the business day preceding the day of filing of a late statement. A late filing fee may not be assessed for Saturday, Sunday, or legal holidays.
