5210 0680 REPORTING OF FATALITY OR MULTIPLE HOSPITALIZATION INCIDENTS

5210.0680 REPORTING OF FATALITY OR MULTIPLE HOSPITALIZATION INCIDENTS.

Subpart 1 When and where to report. Within eight hours after the death of any employee from a work-related incident or the inpatient hospitalization of three or more employees as a result of a work-related incident, the employer of any employees so affected shall orally report the fatality or multiple hospitalization by telephone or in person to any Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry, Occupational Safety and Health Division (Minnesota OSHA) office After normal business hours and on Saturdays, Sundays, and state holidays, the report shall be made within the eight–hour time period by using the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration (federal OSHA), United States Department of Labor, toll–free central telephone number (1–800–321–OSHA(6742))

Subp 2 **Application.** The reporting requirement specified in subpart 1 also applies to an employment incident which is not immediately reportable but within 30 days of the occurrence of the incident subsequently results in a death or hospitalization of three or more employees

Subp 3. Exception. If the employer does not learn of a reportable incident at the time it occurs and the incident would otherwise be reportable under subparts 1 and 2, the employer shall make the report within eight hours of the time the incident is reported to any agent or employee of the employer

Subp 4 **Report contents.** Each report required by this part shall include the following information

- A establishment name,
- B location of the incident,
- C time of the incident,
- D. number of fatalities or hospitalized employees,
- E name and telephone number of a contact person, and
- F. a brief description of the incident
