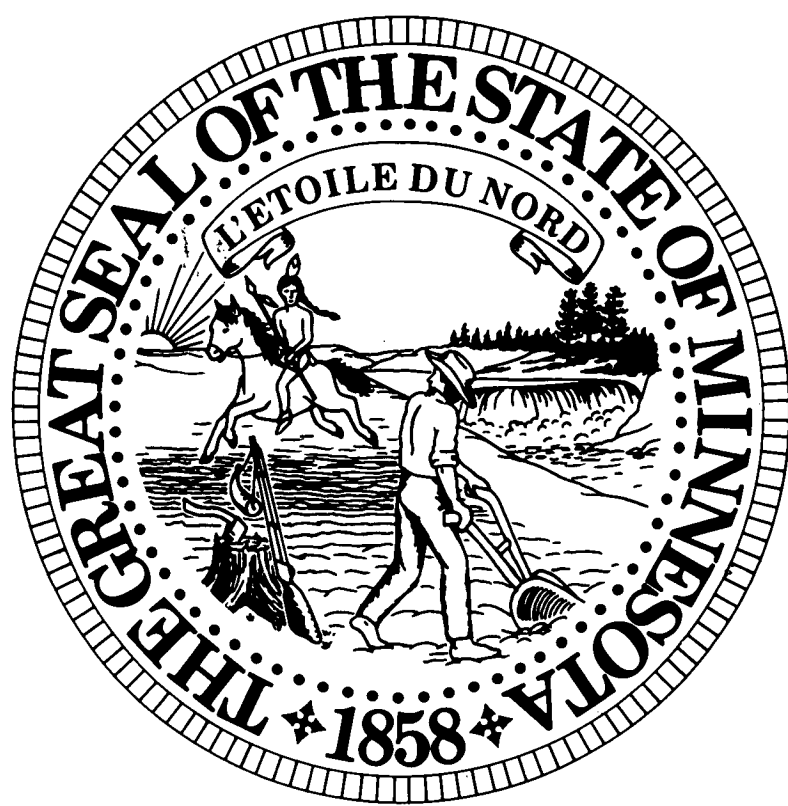

It also contains executive orders of the governor; commissioners' orders; state contracts and advertised bids; professional, technical and consulting contracts; non-state public contracts; state grants; decisions of the supreme court; a monthly calendar of scheduled cases before the supreme court; and other announcements. The Thursday edition contains additional state contracts and advertised bids, and the most complete listing of contract awards available in one source.

In accordance with expressed legislative intent that the *State Register* be self-supporting, the following subscription rates have been established: the Monday edition costs \$140.00 per year and includes an index issue published in August (single issues are available at the address listed above for \$3.50 per copy); the combined Monday and Thursday editions cost \$195.00 (subscriptions are not available for just the *Contracts Supplement*); trial subscriptions are available for \$60.00, include both the Monday and Thursday edition, last for 13 weeks, and may be converted to a full subscription anytime by making up the price difference. No refunds will be made in the event of subscription cancellation.

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NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 75 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific *Minnesota Rule* chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the *Minnesota Rules* are published. This is a ten-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Proposed and adopted emergency rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

If an agency seeks outside opinion before issuing new rules or rule amendments, it must publish a NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT OUTSIDE OPINION in the *Official Notices* section of the *State Register*. When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues 1-13 inclusive; issues 14-25 inclusive; issue 26, cumulative for issues 1-26; issues 27-38 inclusive; issue 39, cumulative for 1-39; issues 40-51 inclusive; and issue 52, cumulative for 1-52. An annual subject matter index for rules appears in August. 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Proposed Rules

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing, as long as the agency determines that the rules will be noncontroversial in nature. The agency must first publish a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. The notice must advise the public:

1. that they have 30 days in which to submit comment on the proposed rules;
2. that no public hearing will be held unless 25 or more persons make a written request for a hearing within the 30-day comment period;
3. of the manner in which persons shall request a hearing on the proposed rules; and
4. that the rule may be modified if the modifications are supported by the data and views submitted.

If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.14-14.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 14.29 and 14.30, agencies may propose emergency rules under certain circumstances. Proposed emergency rules are published in the *State Register* and, for at least 25 days thereafter, interested persons may submit data and views in writing to the proposing agency.

Proposed Permanent Rules Relating to Merit System

Notice of Intent to Adopt a Rule Without a Public Hearing

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Department of Health intends to adopt the above-entitled rule without a public hearing following the procedures set forth in the Administrative Procedure Act for adopting rules without a public hearing in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28. The statutory authority to adopt the rule is *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.071.

All persons have 30 days or until 4:30 p.m. on December 26, 1991 in which to submit comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rule or any part or subpart of the rule. Comment is encouraged. Each comment should identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change proposed.

Any person may make a written request for a public hearing on the rule within the 30-day comment period. If 25 or more persons submit a written request for a public hearing within the 30-day comment period, a public hearing will be held unless a sufficient number withdraw their request in writing. Any person requesting a public hearing should state his or her name and address, and is encouraged to identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the request, and any change proposed. If a public hearing is required, the agency will proceed pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20.

The proposed rule may be modified if the modifications are supported by data and views submitted to the agency and do not result in a substantial change in the proposed rule as noticed.

The Minnesota Merit System rules apply to all positions funded in whole or in part by federal grants-in-aid requiring a merit system of personnel administration. The rules cover such areas as classification of positions, compensation, recruitment and examination, certification and appointment, leaves of absence, separation, tenure and reinstatement, and, in general, provide standards for agencies to follow so as to ensure compliance with the Federal Standards for a Merit System of Personnel Administration (5 CFR Part 900).

If adopted, proposed amendments to part 4670.0100 would provide for an expanded definition for "temporary employee" and would repeal the definition of the outdated term "limited term". Amendments to part 4670.2530 would provide for increased flexibility to counties in the use of temporary employees. Minor amendments are proposed to parts 4670.3030 and 4670.3040 to clarify when temporary employees are eligible to accrue vacation and sick leave. Proposed amendments to part 4670.2930 provide clarification of the rights of laid off employees on the layoff list.

A proposed revision to 4670.1320 provides for a recommended salary adjustment of 2.25% for all incumbents on the professional and administrative, health services support, clerical and building maintenance salary schedules who are covered by Merit System compensation plans.

Amendments to 4670.4210-4240 would provide for a 2.25% adjustment to most of the salary ranges for professional and administrative, health services support, clerical and building maintenance positions covered by Merit System compensation plans, since this is the general salary adjustment being recommended for incumbents. Other revisions to 4670.4210-4240 provide for adjustments of varying amounts to the minimum and maximum salaries for some of the classes covered by the Merit System. These adjustments have been proposed to correct compensation inequities based upon comparable work value.

A **STATEMENT OF NEED AND REASONABLENESS** that describes the need for and reasonableness of each provision of the proposed rule and identifies the data and information relied upon to support the proposed rule has been prepared and is available from Betty Carlson, Minnesota Merit System, Second Floor, Human Services Building, 444 Lafayette Road, St. Paul, Minnesota 55155-3822 upon request.

Adoption of these rules will not result in any cost to local public bodies. If no hearing is required, upon adoption of the rule, the rule and the required supporting documents will be submitted to the Attorney General for review as to legality and form to the extent the form relates to legality. 4670.0100 DEFINITIONS.

Subp. 47. **Temporary employee.** "Temporary employee" means an employee who ~~has been~~ is appointed to a position from an eligible register but the appointment has with a definite ending date. A temporary employee's term of employment may not exceed a total of 12 months in any 24-month period in any one agency.

4670.1320 RECOMMENDED ADJUSTMENTS.

The merit system general adjustment recommended for incumbents is ~~four~~ 2-1/4 percent for employees on the professional and administrative, health services support, clerical, and building maintenance salary schedules.

4670.2530 ~~LIMITED TERM TEMPORARY APPOINTMENT.~~

~~If an employee is needed for a limited period of not more than six months, a certification may be made by the supervisor of the names of those eligibles, in the order of their place on an appropriate register, who have indicated willingness to accept temporary employment. Certification shall be made in the manner set forth in part 4670.2100. The duration of the limited term appointment shall be for the period of need only, and in no event shall such appointment continue for more than six months in any 12-month period. The acceptance or refusal of a limited term appointment shall not affect an eligible's standing on a register or his eligibility for appointment to a permanent position, and the period of the limited term appointment shall not constitute a part of a probationary period. Successive limited term appointments to the same position shall not be made, nor shall an employee receive continued limited term appointments.~~

Subpart 1. Approval. The supervisor may approve an appointing authority's temporary appointment for:

- A. filling a vacancy funded for six months or less;
- B. providing an employee for a temporary project not anticipated to last more than six months;
- C. filling a vacancy created by an approved leave of absence; or

D. unusual documented instances, when an appointing authority asks to make a temporary appointment of six months or less to a position otherwise authorized for more than six months.

Subp. 2. From eligible register. Temporary appointments must be made from the eligible register. Certification will be made of the names of those eligibles, in order of their place on an appropriate register, who have indicated willingness to accept temporary employment. Certification must be made according to parts 4670.2100 to 4670.2400. The acceptance or refusal of a temporary appointment does not affect an eligible's standing on a register or eligibility for appointment to a permanent position.

Subp. 3. No available candidates on eligible register. In the absence of available candidates on the eligible register, the supervisor may authorize the appointing authority to make a direct appointment of a person who meets the minimum qualifications of education and experience for the classification, after considering the following documentation submitted by the appointing authority:

A. a statement that there is no appropriate eligible list available or that all eligible candidates on an incomplete certification from an eligible list are unavailable or unsuitable for temporary appointment; and

B. a description of the appointee's qualifications in a manner prescribed by the supervisor to permit examination of the appointee's qualifications.

Subp. 4. Term of appointment. Temporary appointments must be for the period of need only and are limited to a period of six months. An appointing authority may submit a written request to extend a temporary appointment for up to an additional six months, specifying the reason why the extension is necessary. A temporary employee's term of employment may not exceed a total of 12 months in any 24-month period in any one agency. The period of the temporary appointment may not be counted as part of a probationary period. Successive temporary appointments to the same position may not be made.

4670.2930 LAYOFF.

Subpart 1. **Reason for layoff.** An appointing authority may lay off an employee in the classified service by reason of abolishment of the position, lack of funds, shortage of work, or other reason outside the control of the employee. No permanent employee, however, shall be laid off while any emergency, provisional, ~~limited term~~ temporary, or probationary employee is continued in a position of the same class in the agency. Layoff shall be made in inverse order of seniority by employment conditions in the class of work in the agency. Seniority for purposes of layoff shall be the length of service in the class from which layoff occurs in the agency.

Subp. 4. **Layoff list.** The names of permanent or probationary employees laid off or demoted in lieu of layoff shall be placed in order of seniority on the layoff list for the class and the agency from which the layoff took place. The affected employees shall have their names placed also on the reemployment list for the class from which the layoff took place and any other class in which they have permanent or probationary status prior to layoff.

Names of laid off employees will remain on the layoff list for a minimum of one year and eligibility shall be extended to a period of time equal to the employee's previous service in the merit system not to exceed five years. The name of a laid off employee must be removed from the layoff list if the employee fails to accept a position in the former classification and county agency or if the employee is appointed to a permanent position in a class equal to or higher than the one from which the employee was laid off. In such cases, the employee's name must remain on the reemployment list for the class from which the employee was laid off.

4670.3030 VACATION LEAVE.

Subpart 1. **Accrual.** Upon the completion of six full months of satisfactory service in the merit system, vacation leave shall accrue to a permanent, probationary, or trainee employee for the time served at the rate of one working day for each full month of service except as otherwise provided under part 4670.3000. No vacation leave shall be accrued or granted during the first six months of service in the merit system; but upon satisfactory completion of that period, vacation leave shall accrue to a permanent, probationary, or trainee employee for the time served. ~~Limited term~~ Temporary and provisional employees with less than six full months of service and emergency employees shall not accrue vacation leave. Provisional employees with more than six months of service shall accrue vacation leave. Unused vacation leave shall accumulate to a total of at least 24 working days. The agency shall determine the time at which vacation leave may be taken. Vacation leave may not be used before completion of the period in which it is accrued. Part-time employees shall accrue vacation leave on a prorated basis based on hours worked in accordance with a schedule prepared by the appointing authority.

4670.3040 SICK LEAVE.

Subpart 1. **Rate.** Every permanent, probationary, provisional, ~~and limited term~~ or temporary employee shall accrue sick leave at the rate of one working day for each completed month of service, except as otherwise adopted under part 4670.3000, and such accrued sick leave may be used under the conditions prescribed in subparts 2 to 10.

Notice of Intent to Adopt a Rule Without a Public Hearing and Notice of Intent to Adopt a Rule With a Public Hearing If Twenty-five or More Persons Request a Hearing

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Department of Human Services proposes to adopt the above-entitled rule without a public hearing following the procedures set forth in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.22 to 14.28. The specific statutory authority to adopt the rule is *Minnesota Statutes*, section 256B.0625, subdivision 24.

Persons interested in this rule shall have 30 days in which to submit comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rule or any part or subpart of the rule and comment is encouraged. Each comment should identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change proposed.

Any person may make a written request for a public hearing on the rule within the 30-day comment period. If 25 or more persons submit a written request for a public hearing within the 30-day comment period, a public hearing will be held unless a sufficient number withdraw their request in writing. Any person requesting a public hearing should state his or her name and address, and is encouraged to identify the portion of the proposed rule addressed, the reason for the request, and any change proposed. If a public hearing is required, the agency will proceed pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.131 to 14.20. A copy of the proposed rule may be viewed at any of the county welfare or human service agencies in the State of Minnesota.

Parts 9505.1693 to 9505.1748 establish the standards and procedures applicable to the administration of the early and periodic screening, diagnosis, and treatment program under the medical assistance program and part 9505.0445, item establishes the payment rate for EPSDT services. The proposed amendments are for the purposes of ensuring consistency with revisions of applicable federal regulations and of modifying restrictions on administrative contracts for outreach services. The proposed amendments will: 1. replace the two-tiered system of payment rates for EPSDT services so that all screenings will be paid without regard to provider type; 2. change the period used in calculating the rate from a six month to a 12 month interval; 3. modify the standard for assessing a child's growth and development to provide for the judgment of the health professional screening the child; 4. add health education and counseling as a screening standard; 5. require children aged 1 to 5 years to be screened for lead; 6. revise the schedule of age-related screening standards to the greater number recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics; and 7. add community action agencies, Head Start agencies, and public school districts as agencies eligible to have administrative contracts related to EPSDT services.

The maximum payment rates for health services established as covered services by parts 9505.0170 to 9505.0475 shall be as in items A to N.

For EPSDT services ~~provided in a physician supervised clinic~~, the rate shall be the lower of the provider's submitted charge or the 75th percentile of all complete EPSDT screening charges submitted by physician supervised clinics during the previous six month period of November to April. ~~For EPSDT services provided in a nurse supervised clinic, the rate shall be the lower of the provider's submitted charge or the 75th percentile of all screening charges submitted by nurse supervised clinics during the previous six month period of November to April for complete EPSDT screenings during the prior state fiscal year, July 1 to the following June 30.~~ The adjustment necessary to reflect the 75th percentile shall be effective annually on August October 1.

9505.1693 SCOPE AND PURPOSE.

Parts 9505.1693 to 9505.1748 govern the early and periodic screening, diagnosis, and treatment (EPSDT) program.

Parts 9505.1693 to 9505.1748 must be read in conjunction with section 1905(a)(4)(B) of the Social Security Act, as amended through December 31, 1981, and the Code of Federal Regulations, title 42, part 441, subpart B, as amended through October 1,

1987, and section 6403 of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1989. The purpose of the EPSDT program is to identify potentially handicapping conditions in children eligible for medical assistance, to provide diagnosis and treatment for conditions identified, and to encourage parents and their children to use health care services when necessary.

9505.1718 SCREENING STANDARDS FOR AN EPSDT CLINIC.

Subp. 2. **Health and developmental history.** A history of a child's health and development must be obtained from the child, parent of the child, or an adult who is familiar with the child's health history. The history must include information on sexual development, lead and tuberculosis exposure, nutrition intake, ~~and~~ chemical abuse, and social, emotional, and mental health status.

Subp. 9. **Development.** ~~The Denver Prescreening Developmental Questionnaire (PDQ) or the Denver Developmental Screening Test (DDST) must be administered to a child under six years of age. The DDST must be administered to a child whose score on the PDQ is below the age norms for that test. The provider may use an alternative developmental screening test in place of the PDQ or DDST, if approval of the alternative test is given by the department in writing. The alternative test must be standardized, must have norms for the age range tested, and must have written procedures for its administration, scoring, and interpretation.~~

A child ~~six to 20 years of age~~ must be screened for the following according to the screening provider's standard procedures: fine and gross motor development, speech and language development, social development, ~~and~~ cognitive development, and self-help skills. Standardized tests that are used in screening must be culturally sensitive and have norms for the age range tested, written procedures for administration and for scoring and interpretation that are statistically reliable and valid. The provider must use a combination of the child's health and developmental history and standardized test or clinical judgment to determine the child's developmental status or need for further assessment.

Subp. 13. **Laboratory tests.** Laboratory tests must be done according to items A to F.

B. ~~An erythrocyte protoporphyrin (EP) test must be done for a child whose physical examination under subpart 4 indicates possible lead toxicity; and for a child age nine months to six years whose health history indicates that the child:~~

- ~~(2) has shared the residence of a parent or other person who participates in a lead-related occupation or hobby;~~

~~If an EP test is elevated above the level of 35 micrograms of lead per deciliter of whole blood, the child must be referred for further testing. A child aged one to five years must be screened for lead through the use of either an erythrocyte protoporphyrin (EP) test or a blood lead screening test. When the result of the EP or blood test is greater than the maximum allowable level set by the Centers for Disease Control of the United States Public Health Service, the child must be referred for a venous blood lead test. A child with a venous blood lead level greater than the maximum allowable level set by the Centers for Disease Control must be referred for diagnosis and treatment.~~

Health education and health counseling concerning the child's health must be offered to the child who is being screened and to the child's parent or representative. 9505.1748 CONTRACTS FOR ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES.

Subpart 1. **Authority.** A local agency may contract with a county public health nursing service ~~or~~, a community health clinic, a Head Start agency, a community action agency, or a school district for early and periodic screening, diagnosis, and treatment administrative services. Early and periodic screening, diagnosis, and treatment administrative services include outreach; notification; appointment scheduling and transportation; follow-up; and documentation. The Minnesota Merit System rules provide for a system of personnel administration for 73 county welfare and human service agencies. The rules apply to all positions and employees engaged in the administration of community social services or income maintenance programs funded in whole or in part by federal grants-in-aid requiring a merit system of personnel administration. The rules cover such areas as classification of positions, compensation, recruitment and examination, certification and appointment, leaves of absence, separation, tenure and reinstatement, and, in general, provide standards for agencies to follow so as to ensure compliance with the Federal Standards for a Merit System of Personnel Administration (5 CFR Part 900).

If adopted, proposed amendments to part 9575.0010 would provide for an expanded definition for "temporary employee". Amendments to 9575.0680 would provide for increased flexibility to counties in the use of temporary employees. Minor amendments are proposed to parts 9575.1030 and 9575.1040 to clarify when temporary employees are eligible to accrue vacation and sick leave. Proposed amendments to part 9575.0930 provide clarification of the rights of laid off employees on the layoff list.

A proposed revision to 9575.0350 provides for a recommended salary adjustment of 2.25% for all incumbents on the professional, support, clerical, and maintenance and trades salary schedules who are covered by Merit System compensation plans.

If adopted, proposed amendments to 9575.1500 would provide for a 2.25% adjustment to most of the salary ranges for professional, support, clerical, and maintenance and trades positions covered by Merit System compensation plans, since this is the general salary adjustment being recommended for incumbents. Other revisions to 9575.1500 provide for adjustments of varying amounts to the minimum and maximum salaries for some of the classes covered by the Merit System. These adjustments have been proposed to correct compensation inequities based upon comparable work value.

Amendments are also proposed to part 9575.1500 providing class titles and minimum and maximum salaries for newly established classifications and deleting class titles and minimum and maximum salaries for abolished classes.

The proposed changes to parts 9575.0680, 9575.0930, 9575.1030, and 9575.1040 would then apply to local and county emergency management agencies. Amendments to 9575.0680 would provide for increased flexibility to counties in the use of temporary employees. Minor amendments are proposed to parts 9575.1030 and 9575.1040 to clarify when temporary employees are eligible to accrue vacation and sick leave. Proposed amendments to part 9575.0930 provide clarification of the rights of laid off employees on the layoff list.

A proposed revision to 7520.0650 provides for a recommended salary adjustment of 2.25% for all incumbents on the professional and clerical salary schedules.

If adopted, proposed amendments to 7520.1000-1100 would provide for a 2.25% adjustment to the salary ranges for professional and clerical positions covered by Merit System compensation plans, since this is the general salary adjustment being recommended for incumbents.

Persons who apply for renewal of licenses in this field after June 30, 2007, who do not hold a master's degree in speech/language pathology will be required to meet continuing education requirements and demonstrate completion of 24 quarter or 16 semester hours of postbaccalaureate college credit in speech/language pathology. These credits may be earned at any time between the granting of the baccalaureate degree in speech/language pathology and the time of renewal of the license after June 30, 2007.

The Board's authority to promulgate the proposed rules is provided by *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 125.05, subd. 1 and *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 125.185, subd. 4.

The Board estimates that there will be no cost to local bodies in the State to implement the rules for the two years immediately following their adoption within the meaning of *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 14.11. These proposed rules will not directly affect small businesses within the meaning of *Minnesota Statutes*, Section 14.115.

Subpart 1. **Licensure requirements.** A candidate recommended for licensure to ~~teach students with communication disorders as an educational speech/language pathologist~~ (prekindergarten to grade 12) shall:

A. hold a ~~baccalaureate~~ master's degree;

B. satisfactorily complete core skill requirements in special education enumerated in part 8700.5500; and

C. satisfactorily complete a preparation program leading to the licensure of ~~teachers of students with communication disorders~~ educational speech/language pathologists, approved by the Board of Teaching.

Subp. 2. **Program requirements; regular education.** Each program leading to the licensure of ~~teachers of special education: communication disorders educational speech/language pathologists~~ (prekindergarten to grade 12) shall provide candidates recommended for licensure with preparation in the following regular education areas:

Subp. 3. **Program requirements; ~~communication disorders~~ educational speech/language pathologists.** Each program leading to the licensure of ~~teachers of students with communication disorders~~ educational speech/language pathologists (prekindergarten to grade 12) shall provide candidates recommended for licensure with preparation in the following ~~special education~~ areas, consisting of a minimum of 60 quarter hours, or the equivalent.

Subp. 4. **Program approval for institutions.** An institution applying to the Board of Teaching for approval of its preparation program for ~~teachers of students with communication disorders~~ educational speech/language pathologists shall comply with part 8700.7700. ~~Preparation programs submitted for approval that require as a minimum an advanced degree must not be approved by the Board of Teaching.~~

Subp. 5. **Continuing licensure.** A continuing license shall be issued and renewed according to rules of the Board of Teaching governing continuing ~~licenses~~ licensure.

Subp. 5a. Future requirements for renewal of certain licenses. Notwithstanding subpart 5, after June 30, 2007, a person who makes application for renewal of continuing licensure as an educational speech/language pathologist who does not hold a master's degree in speech/language pathology must provide evidence that at least 24 quarter or 16 semester hours of postbaccalaureate college credit in speech/language pathology or related special education instruction and services have been earned and otherwise comply with subpart 5.

Subp. 6. **Effective date.** After June 30, ~~1990~~ 1994, a person who makes application for initial licensure as a teacher of students with communication disorders an educational speech/language pathologist must hold a master's degree and comply with ~~this part~~ subpart 1.

Subp. 7. Baccalaureate degree. A person holding a baccalaureate degree who applies for initial licensure as an educational speech/language pathologist before July 1, 1994, must comply with the requirements of this part, except the requirement to have a master's degree. On July 1, 1994, this subpart is repealed.

Section 1. Section 2 of Commissioner's Order No. 2367 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2. Angling season and daily and possession limits:

Salmon	Continuous	10 In aggregate. Not more than 1 may be Atlantic salmon, minimum size 10 inches in length.

All other species may be taken by angling, spearing, and archery only in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the laws and regulations relating to the taking of such fish in the inland waters of the state.

Sec. 2. Except as provided by this order, all provisions of Commissioner's Order No. 2367 shall remain in full force and effect.

Revenue Notices

Effective July 1, 1991, the Department of Revenue has authority to issue revenue notices. A revenue notice is a policy statement made by the department that provides interpretation, details, or supplementary information concerning the application of law or rules. This authority was provided by the Legislature in 1991 Session Laws Chapter 291, article 21, section 6 and will be codified at *Minnesota Statutes* section 270.0604.

Department of Revenue

Revenue Notice #91-17: Reporting Required of Regulated Investment Companies of Federally Tax-Exempt Interest Dividends

Effective tax year 1991 regulated investment companies who pay federally tax-exempt interest dividends of \$10 or more to a Minnesota resident individual must, by January 30, 1992, notify the individual of the amount of 1991 federal exempt interest dividend which is **not** exempt from Minnesota individual income tax.

The Department of Revenue would prefer the notification to read: "Some or all of the federal tax-exempt dividend you have received is subject to Minnesota income tax. The amount which is **not** exempt from Minnesota tax is \$ _____ and must be added to federal taxable income to arrive at Minnesota taxable income." However, the Department will find acceptable any statement which tells the shareholder that "X dollars" or "X percent of your federally tax-exempt interest dividend" is not exempt from Minnesota tax and must be added to federal taxable income in computing Minnesota taxable income.

The notification can be either a part of the annual 1099 sent to the shareholder or a separate statement sent with the annual tax information sent to the shareholder.

Finally, if all of federally tax-exempt interest dividends are also exempt from Minnesota individual income taxes (RIC investment in state and local obligations is totally in Minnesota obligations), notification to the shareholder is not required.

Request for Proposal for Feasibility Study on Corporate Giving to the Adopt-a-Park Program

INTRODUCTION

The DNR Division of Parks and Recreation is requesting proposals from qualified firms and individuals to conduct a feasibility study to determine the interest level of corporate giving to Minnesota's 66 state parks. The study will be used to determine if the Division will pursue a corporate fundraising campaign.

This request for proposal does not obligate the State to complete the project, and the State reserves the right to cancel the solicitation if it is considered to be in its best interest.

BACKGROUND

The Division of Parks and Recreation manages 66 state parks and waysides. In these, over 200,000 acres are Minnesota's most unique and valuable cultural, natural and historical resources. Minnesota state parks use is increasing dramatically. In 1986, state park attendance was 5.5 million visitor occasions. In four years, state park attendance has grown over 40% to a 1990 level of 7.8 million visitor occasions. The Division employs 200 full-time staff distributed across the state in the central office, six regional offices and in 66 state parks. There are also 600 seasonal and part-time staff in state parks.

The mission of the Division of Parks and Recreation is to provide a state park system that perpetuates Minnesota's scenic beauty and its natural and cultural resources, while being responsive to public needs and expectations by providing a diversity of recreational opportunities.

Currently, public services have been curtailed because of a budget shortfall of over \$1.8 million in FY 1992 for its 65 state parks. This shortfall, the recession and the fiscal condition of the state of Minnesota calls the Division to look at additional sources of funding to provide a quality experience for park visitors. The recent passage of legislation, Adopt-a-Park, (Chapter 242, S.F. No. 1027) gives the Division the opportunity to fundraise and strengthen the volunteer effort.

ADOPT-A-PARK LEGISLATION

The Adopt-a-Park legislation, signed into law on May 28, 1991 requires the Division of Parks and Recreation to conduct a study to determine the major elements of the program. All park management, regional managers, park managers, some park naturalist and resource specialists were surveyed about their concerns and desires about this program. The majority of respondents placed a high priority on finding alternative/additional sources of funding to ease the budget shortfall. Over 64% of the respondents requested that the Division take a serious look at a corporate fundraising campaign for the additional funds. This research indicates a need to have an outside consultant conduct a feasibility study to determine corporate response to Minnesota state parks asking for dollars, and developing partnerships with them.

FUNDRAISING/PARTNERSHIPS DEVELOPED

Minnesota state parks celebrated its 100th year in 1991. The Minnesota legislature required that programs be developed for the public to celebrate this landmark. However, few funds were allocated to develop the programs.

To accomplish this mandate, Minnesota state parks launched a fundraising campaign. The Division raised \$100,000+, but often had to do "mid-course corrections" because a feasibility study had not been done to determine corporate response to this effort.

THE FEASIBILITY STUDY

Before initiating the study, the awarded contractor must become familiar with the following:

- Department/Division governing laws/policies, attitudes toward corporate fundraising
- The Centennial fundraising effort. Who gave/Who didn't
- The Adopt-a-Park legislation (*Minnesota Laws 1991*, Chapter 242, Section 1)
- The Adopt-a-Park research from park staff
- The Adopt-a-Park focus group research
- Union issues

AUDIENCES FOR THE STUDY

There are three primary audiences to be involved in this study:

1. Selected DNR employees
2. Selected corporations and foundations, both in the Metro area, and in Greater Minnesota
3. Individuals who are knowledgeable about state parks and corporate giving/foundation giving

STUDY GOALS

There are three primary goals of this study, including:

1. Assess the climate for corporate and foundation support to Minnesota state parks. Corporate giving includes cash contributions, in-kind contributions, staff-volunteer time, and/or partnerships.
2. Identify concerns of DNR management to the idea of corporate fundraising and partnerships.
3. Provide recommendations as to whether Minnesota state parks should proceed with a corporate fundraising effort. If the recommendation is yes, provide fundraising strategies and structures (for example, 501C3).

CORPORATE STUDY OBJECTIVES

The specific objectives for the corporate fundraising feasibility study are:

1. Through personal interviews, discover the perceptions corporations have about Minnesota state parks, in terms of financial condition, public service, public satisfaction, and problems with the state park system.
2. Determine concerns (positive and negative) corporations and foundations may have toward a state agency requesting contributions or developing partnerships.
3. Identify CEOs who will want to assist Minnesota state parks in raising contributions.
4. Identify the types (and amounts) of gifts corporations may give to Minnesota state parks.
5. Explore the types of projects/partnerships corporations and foundations will support.
6. Provide a potential donor list of CEO and foundation prospects (both in the metro area and in Greater Minnesota) and for what projects.
7. Determine what types of recognition corporations and foundations will want, and at what levels, for their philanthropy.

DNR STUDY OBJECTIVES

The second audience that needs to be surveyed are DNR management. The specific objectives for the DNR study are similar to the corporate study:

1. Discover the perceptions DNR management have about Minnesota state parks, in terms of financial condition, public service, public satisfaction, and problems with the state park system.
2. Identify roadblocks (legal, professional, personal, inter-departmental) DNR employees may perceive about launching a corporate fundraising effort.
3. Identify DNR employees who will want to work with state parks in raising funds.
4. Identify the types of projects parks employees need funding for, and/or projects they would support.
5. Determine what types of recognition DNR management and park staff will allow, and at what levels, based on legislation.

PROJECT TASKS

The following tasks are the minimum required for successful completion of the study:

1. Review the Adopt-a-Park legislation, field study, and focus group research.
2. Talk with other DNR divisions (forestry, nongame program, parks) and other "state" agencies (MHS, Minnesota Zoo, and MnDOT) about their fundraising effort, and determine successful fundraising methods/approaches.
3. Talk with key park staff as to their visions for Adopt and fundraising.
4. Write feasibility questionnaire interview form for the two audiences (DNR management and corporations) and submit for review, discussion and revision.
5. Set up personal interviews with DNR management and CEOs (in the metro area and greater Minnesota). No DNR staff assistance can be provided on this task.
6. Gather data/impressions.
7. Computerize data, analyze data and survey results.
8. Write a report, summarizing the data from both groups, and make recommendations as to whether the Division should proceed with a corporate fundraising effort. If the recommendation is to proceed, outline action steps to launch a successful fundraising campaign.

Applicants may propose alternative approaches, additional tasks or activities to this research structure if the ideas will substantially improve the results of the project.

A detailed work plan, which will identify the major staff-person responsible for the project, the tasks to be accomplished, and projected dates for the completion of each task. Please attach an estimated cost for each major task, not to exceed a total budget of \$15,000. Explain when you can start and finish the study, and write the report. 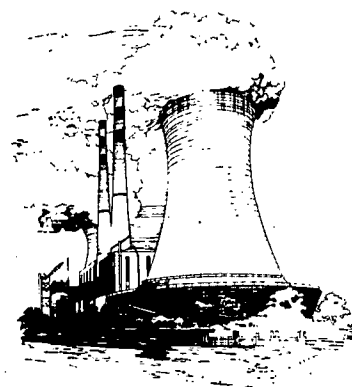

Free Business Assistance Referrals Available by Phone: Small businesses and entrepreneurs can now get referrals to providers of business and financial assistance by dialing a toll-free number.

Minnesota Project Outreach (MPO) has created a computerized directory, or database, containing descriptions of over 700 sources of business assistance. Minnesotans can dial **1-800-338-7005 outside the Twin Cities** or **851-7750 in the Twin Cities** with any business-related question or problem. MPO Help Staff will search the business assistance services database for the nearest organizations that can help.

By using the referral service, businesses can find assistance with accounting, financing, marketing, business planning, personnel recruitment and training, legal questions, relocation, and technical questions. The directory includes providers and programs sponsored by federal and state agencies, educational institutions, chambers of commerce, civic organizations, community development groups, local governments, and private industry associations.

In addition to using the toll-free number, interested people can search the directory by going to one of 75 public access sites throughout the state which have a computer connection to MPO. Any Minnesotan with a computer and a modem may access the business assistance services database by dialing **1-800-367-1033**.
