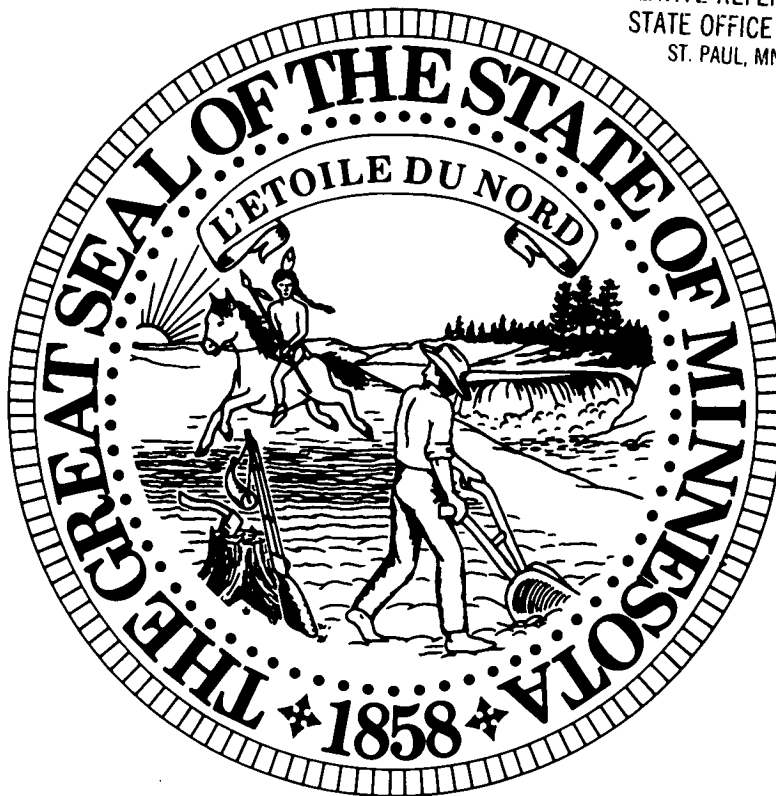

The *State Register* is the official publication of the State of Minnesota, containing executive and commissioners' orders, proposed and adopted rules, official and revenue notices, state and non-state contracts, contract awards, grants, a monthly calendar of cases to be heard by the state supreme court, and announcements.

A *Contracts Supplement* is published every Thursday and contains additional state contracts and advertised bids, and the most complete source of state contract awards available in one source.

\*Deadline extensions may be possible at the editor's discretion; however, none will be made beyond the second Wednesday (12 calendar days) preceding the issue date for rules, proposed rules and executive orders, or beyond the Wednesday (5 calendar days) preceding the issue date for official notices. Requests for deadline extensions should be made only in valid emergency situations.

\*\*Notices of public hearings on proposed rules and notices of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing are published in the Proposed Rules section and must be submitted two weeks prior to the issue date.

The *State Register* is published every Monday (Tuesday when Monday is a holiday) by the State of Minnesota, Department of Administration, Print Communications Division, 117 University Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota 55155, pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.46. A *State Register Contracts Supplement* is published every Thursday. The Monday edition is the vehicle for conveying all information about state agency rulemaking, including official notices; hearing notices; proposed, adopted and emergency rules. It also contains executive orders of the governor; commissioners' orders; state contracts and advertised bids; professional, technical and consulting contracts; non-state public contracts; state grants; decisions of the supreme court; a monthly calendar of scheduled cases before the supreme court; and other announcements. The Thursday edition contains additional state contracts and advertised bids, and the most complete listing of contract awards available in one source.

In accordance with expressed legislative intent that the *State Register* be self-supporting, the following subscription rates have been established: the Monday edition costs \$140.00 per year and includes an index issue published in August (single issues are available at the address listed above for \$3.50 per copy); the combined Monday and Thursday editions cost \$195.00 (subscriptions are not available for just the *Contracts Supplement*); trial subscriptions are available for \$60.00, include both the Monday and Thursday edition, last for 13 weeks, and may be converted to a full subscription anytime by making up the price difference. No refunds will be made in the event of subscription cancellation.

Both editions are delivered postpaid to points in the United States, second class postage paid for the Monday edition at St. Paul, MN, first class for the Thursday edition. Publication Number 326630 (ISSN 0146-7751).

# Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

## NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 75 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific *Minnesota Rule* chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the *Minnesota Rules* are published. This is a ten-volume bound collection of all adopted rules in effect at the time. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Proposed and adopted emergency rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

If an agency seeks outside opinion before issuing new rules or rule amendments, it must publish a NOTICE OF INTENT TO SOLICIT OUTSIDE OPINION in the *Official Notices* section of the *State Register*. When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules and withdrawn proposed rules are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety in the *State Register*, only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted. For a more detailed description of the rulemaking process, see the *Minnesota Guidebook to State Agency Services*.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues 1-13 inclusive; issues 14-25 inclusive; issue 26, cumulative for issues 1-26; issues 27-38 inclusive; issue 39, cumulative for 1-39; issues 40-51 inclusive; and issue 52, cumulative for 1-52. An annual subject matter index for rules appears in August. 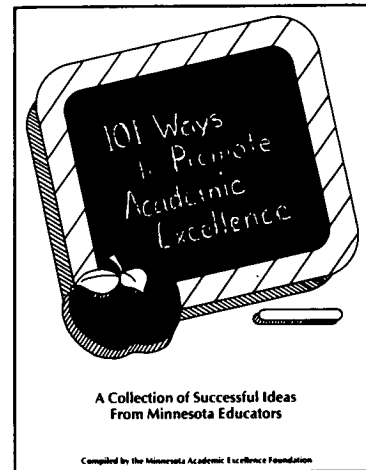

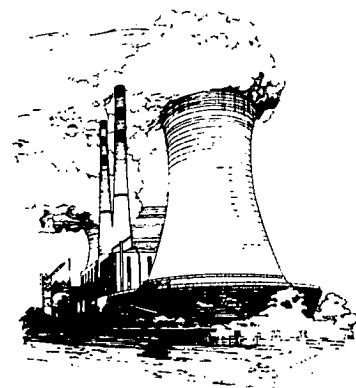

The rule adopted in the *State Register*, Volume 16, dated 8 June 1992, page 2688, contained an error in Rule No. 7670.0660 "Amendment to Section 503: Equipment Efficiency."

Section Subpart 1 is corrected as follows:

### 7670.0660 AMENDMENT TO SECTION 503: EQUIPMENT EFFICIENCY.

Subpart 1. **HVAC equipment efficiency.** Sections 503.4 of the Model Energy Code, with the exception of sections 503.4.2.3 and 503.4.4, is amended to read:

503.4 HVAC equipment performance requirements. HVAC equipment must meet minimum efficiency requirements specified in Standard RS-10 listed in chapter 7 with the following exceptions:

(1) Table 8.3-6 is amended to cite the reference standard for air conditioners, air cooled as ARI 360-86; to cite the reference standard for air conditioners, water/evaporatively cooled as ARI 360.86; and efficiency requirements added as follows:

Air Conditioners	≤760,000 Btu/h	>760,000 Btu/h
(air cooled)	8.5 EER	8.7 <u>8.2</u> EER



**WHEREAS**, the resources of local governments and private relief agencies are being fully utilized to respond to this crisis; and


**WHEREAS**, those resources are expected to become exhausted as the recovery process continues;

## Revenue Notices

Effective July 1, 1991, the Department of Revenue has authority to issue revenue notices. A revenue notice is a policy statement made by the department that provides interpretation, details, or supplementary information concerning the application of law or rules. This authority was provided by the Legislature in 1991 Session Laws Chapter 291, article 21, section 6 and will be codified at *Minnesota Statutes* section 270.0604.

### Department of Revenue

#### Revenue Notice #92-16: Corporate Franchise Tax—Treatment of Partnership Income of Corporate Partners

When a corporation is a partner in a partnership, the corporation's pro-rata share of partnership net distributable income and pro-rata share of Minnesota additions and subtractions are included in "Minnesota net income or loss" (line 5 of 1991 Minnesota Form M-4). If the corporation and the partnership would be considered unitary under *Minnesota Statutes* § 290.17, subd. 4, disregarding paragraph (e) (50 percent indirect or direct ownership needed for unity of ownership), the corporation's pro-rata share of partnership income is apportionable income of the corporation. Consequently, the corporation would combine its pro-rata share of the partnership's sales, property, and payroll factors with its own factors on lines 4 through 9 of Schedule A of the Form M-4. Further, in computing lines 2 (total nonapportionable net income) and 15 (Minnesota nonapportionable net income) of the 1991 Minnesota Schedule A of the M-4, the corporation would not include any portion of the corporation's share of partnership income or loss.

If on the other hand a partnership and a corporation are not unitary, the corporation reports its share of partnership income as nonapportionable net income. The partnership then computes its Minnesota assignable net income on the basis of the partnership's net business income and sales, property and payroll factors if the partnership business is conducted partly within and partly without Minnesota. The partnership business income is totally assigned to Minnesota if the partnership business is conducted entirely in Minnesota. The corporation then includes its pro-rata share of partnership income or loss on line 2 of Schedule A and its pro-rata share of Minnesota assignable partnership income or loss on line 15 of Schedule A.

The adoption of the rule is authorized by *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 256B.74, subdivision 10; 256.01, subdivision 2, clause (6); and 256.01, subdivision 4, clause (2).

The Department of Human Services proposes to adopt permanent rules to implement the provider surcharge under Laws 1991, chapter 292, article 4, section 21; *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 256.9657 and *Laws 1992*, chapter 513, article 7, sections 15 to 21 and 88. The proposed rule will: implement statutory surcharges that impose a monthly surcharge on licensed nursing homes, Minnesota hospitals, and health maintenance organizations (HMOs); establish standards governing provider notice and appeals; establish repayment procedures for providers who prevail in an appeal; and establish procedures to assure provider compliance with the surcharge program.

The State Department of Human Services requests information and opinions concerning the subject matter of the rule. Interested persons or groups may submit data or views on the subject matter of concern in writing or orally. #### Public Notice Regarding Changes in the Medical Assistance (MA) Program and the General Assistance Medical Care Program (GAMC)

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** to recipients and providers of Minnesota Medical Assistance (MA) and to the public of certain changes affecting the MA program that were enacted by the 1992 Legislature. This notice is published pursuant to *Code of Federal Regulations*, Title 42, section 447.205. The purpose of this notice is to inform the public of changes in the MA program due to changes

in State law. The changes to the MA program expected to result in an estimated net increase in MA expenditures of \$20 million for State fiscal year 1993.

Changes were made in the following areas:

- I. MA eligibility
- II. MA services
- III. MA payment rates
- IV. Nursing Facility services
- V. GAMC changes
- VI. Other

Information related to implementation of these provisions will be sent to local human services agencies through instructional and informational bulletins and manual updates, to MA recipients with their identification cards, and to health care providers through newsletters, bulletins and updates to the provider manuals.

### **HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES OMNIBUS APPROPRIATIONS BILL, H.F. 2694, LAWS OF MINNESOTA 1992, CHAPTER 513 (Unless otherwise noted)**

#### **I. MA ELIGIBILITY**

- Effective July 1, 1992, persons under age 21 will not be subject to a limit on their assets or the assets deemed available from their parents. Laws 1992, chapter 549, article 4, § 12.
- Effective July 1, 1992, a homestead is not counted as an asset for a person in a long term care facility as long as the person reasonably can be expected to return home. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.056, subd. 2 (1990).
- A person with a one-month spenddown has the option of paying the spenddown amount to the county and receiving an MA card that does not contain a spenddown obligation. This process will be in place September 1, 1992. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.056, subd. 5 (1990).
- Effective January 1, 1993, a person with income at or below 110% of the Federal Poverty Guideline is eligible for payment of Medicare part B premiums. The asset limit for this program is \$4,000 for individuals and \$6,000 for a family of two or more. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.057, subd. 3a (1990).
- Effective July 1, 1992, assets held by a married couple on the date of an MA application and determined to be available to an institutionalized spouse must be used for the health care or personal needs of the institutionalized spouse. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.059, subd. 5 (1990).
- Effective July 1, 1992, the assets of a married couple, one of which is institutionalized, will be assessed as of the first period of institutionalization that is 30 days or longer. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.059, subd. 2 (1990).
- Effective July 1, 1992, certain types of income, investments and payments for services will be considered transfers for less than fair market value. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.0595, subd. 1 (1990).
- Effective July 1, 1992, the Department may use alternative care funds to pay the MA spenddown for persons in adult foster care who would otherwise be served under the AC program. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.0913, subd. 4 (Supp. 1991).
- Effective July 1, 1992, the parental fee law was amended to clarify that there is only one deduction from the fee attributable to keeping the child at home. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.14, subd. 2 (1990).
- Effective July 1, 1992, a resident of a nursing facility or ICF/MR is entitled to have income taxes deducted from earned income, but only to the extent that s/he has a state or federal income tax obligation. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.36 (1990).
- Effective July 1, 1992, a clause in a trust created after July 1, 1992 that purports to make trust assets or income unavailable to the beneficiary if the beneficiary becomes eligible for public assistance is unenforceable. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 501B.

#### **II. MA SERVICES**

- Effective July 1, 1992, the statute governing the drug formulary committee was amended. The committee may recommend drugs for prior authorization, if opportunity for public input is provided. Before the commissioner may require prior authorization for a drug, the committee must develop criteria to be used for identifying drugs, the committee must hold a public forum and receive public comment for 15 days, the commissioner must provide the committee with information on the impact of placing the drug on prior authorization will have on the quality of care, and whether the drug is subject to abuse. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.0625, subd. 13 (Supp. 1991).
- Effective July 1, 1992, nutritional products for combined milk allergy require prior authorization. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.0625, subd. 13 (Supp. 1991).



- Effective July 1, 1992, a drug utilization review (DUR) board will be established to: implement a retrospective and prospective DUR program; to develop and implement criteria and practice parameters for appropriate prescribing to be used in the drug utilization review; to develop and implement interventions for physicians, pharmacists, and patients; to establish an appeals process for physicians and pharmacists; and to publish and disseminate education information to physicians and pharmacists regarding the board and the DUR program. The board must report to the commissioner annually regarding its activities and the DUR program, the effectiveness of interventions, administrative costs and fiscal impact of the program. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.0625 (1990).

- Effective upon federal approval, case management for persons with mental retardation or related conditions is a covered service to the extent defined in state plan. MA pays approved vendors for case management services to MA recipients. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, §§ 256B.0625, subd. 20a and 256B.092, subd. 2a (1990).

- Effective July 1, 1992, the Commissioner is required to establish a pilot project in Dakota County to test alternatives to the delivery of mental health services required under the Minnesota Comprehensive Mental Health Act. A proposal for integrated program funding must be developed by January 1, 1993. Integrated funding may include MA and GAMC. Laws 1992, chapter 513, article 9, § 39.

- A vendor of medical care and an HMO must participate as a provider or contractor in the MA program, GAMC program and Health Right plan as a condition of participating as a provider in health insurance plans or contractor for state employees, the public employees insurance plan, the workers' compensation system, and plans provided through the Minnesota Comprehensive Health Association (MCHA). The commissioner shall establish participation requirements for HMOs. For other providers, participation in MA means that the provider accepts new MA patients or at least 20% of the provider's patients are covered by MA, GAMC or the Health Right plan as their primary source of coverage. *Laws of Minnesota* 1990, chapter 549, article 4, § 13.

### III. MA PAYMENT RATES

- Effective July 1, 1992, reimbursement for therapy services provided by a physical therapy assistant under the direction of a physical therapist who is on the premises shall be the same rate as reimbursement for services provided by a physical therapist. Reimbursement for therapy services provided by an occupational therapy assistant under the direction of an occupational therapist who is on the premises shall be the same rate as reimbursement for services provided by an occupational therapist. Reimbursement for services provided by a therapy assistant under the direction of a therapist who is not on the premises shall be 65% of the above rate.

- Effective July 1, 1992 and until MMIS II upgrade, a pharmacy provider may require a spenddown client to pay for services at the time services are provided. The provider must then bill MA, and if the payment is received, must return to the client the amount paid by the client. Providers may only use this option if they apply similar credit restrictions to private pay or privately insured individuals. Providers must inform clients of appeal rights and of their potential eligibility for Health Right or the Children's Health Plan. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.0625, subd. 13 (Supp. 1991).

- Effective July 1, 1992, the commissioner may require a hospital to use the administrative reconsideration process for appeals of inpatient hospital services determined to be medically unnecessary before the hospital may file a contested case. DHS may recover payments after the reconsideration process and prior to the contested case. This change applies to MA and GAMC. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256.9685, subd. 1 (Supp. 1991).

- The Commissioner may establish exceptions to utilization review requirements after publication in the *State Register* and a 30-day comment period. This change applies to MA and GAMC. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256.9685, subd. 1 (Supp. 1991).

- Effective October 1, 1992, the MA cost index increases by 1 percentage point to reflect changes in technology. This change applies to MA only. For the 1994/1995 biennium, there is no automatic inflation (except the technology factor) under MA or GAMC. DHS must include budget change requests based on hospital index. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256.969, subd. 1 (Supp. 1991).

- Effective October 1, 1992, inpatient disproportionate share adjustments (DPA) paid to hospitals (MA only) with utilization rates in excess of arithmetic mean, are as follows: (1) one standard deviation or less = difference between actual utilization rate and the arithmetic mean times the total of operating and property payment rates; (2) above one standard deviation = 1.1 times adjustment in paragraph (1). If federal match is not available, the adjustments shall be reduced pro rata so that all adjustments qualify for the match. The commissioner must report annually on the number of facilities receiving adjustments. This change applies to MA only. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256.969, subd. 9 (Supp. 1991).

- For admissions on or after October 1, 1990, MA payment rates for small rural hospitals with 100 or fewer annualized admissions are increased 20%. Rates for rural hospitals with over 100 but less than 250 annualized admissions are increased 15%. For small rural hospitals eligible for DPA, the hospital receives the DPA plus the amount of the small rural increase that exceeds the DPA amount. This change applies to MA only. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256.969, subd. 20 (Supp. 1991).

- Effective October 1, 1992, chemical dependency and mental health inpatient admissions are paid per admission. This change applies to MA only. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256.969, subd. 21 (Supp. 1991).

- Effective July 1, 1992, inpatient rates are rebased. If the MMIS upgrade is not implemented by July 1, 1992, prospective

adjustment will be made to compensate for late rebasing. A 10% interim increase to hospitals that qualify for the small rural increase or an alternative amount if requested. Replaces pass-through cost settlements with prospective rates after June 30, 1992. This change applies to MA and GAMC. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256.9695, subd. 3 (1990).

- Effective April 30, 1992, the rate increase to 70th percentile of peer group for small hospitals that was to have taken effect after the MMIS upgrade is repealed. This change applies to MA and GAMC. Repeals *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256.969, subd. 7 (Supp. 1991).

- Effective October 1, 1992, the maximum medical assistance average reimbursement rate for special transportation services is \$13 for the base rate and \$1 per mile. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.0625, subd. 19b (1990).

- Effective July 1, 1992, MA will pay for a wheelchair for an ICF/MR resident outside of the facility's payment rate. A wheelchair purchased outside of the facility's payment rate will be the property of the MA recipient. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.0625, subd. 31 (1990).

- Effective July 1, 1992, for rate years beginning after June 30, 1993, § 256B.433, which regulates the provision of therapy services to nursing facility residents, is amended to include mental health services as a regulated therapy. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.433, subd. 1 (1990).

- Effective October 1, 1992, outpatient hospital facility fee payments increase 32%. For those services for which there is a federal maximum allowable payment, reimbursement shall be the federal maximum allowable payment. Total aggregate payment for outpatient hospital facility fee services shall not exceed the Medicare upper limit. The commissioner may prospectively reduce payment rates to avoid reductions in federal funding from rates that are in excess of the Medicare upper limit. Laws 1992, Chapter 513, article 7, § 130.

- Effective October 1, 1992, certain primary and preventive care physician services rates increase 25% over the rate in effect on June 30, 1992. All other physician services rates increase 15.4% over the rate in effect on June 30, 1992. All physician rates shall be converted from the 50th percentile of 1982 to the 50th percentile of 1989, less the percent in the aggregate this is necessary to equal the above increases. Laws 1992, Chapter 513, article 7, § 131.

- Effective October 1, 1992, dental services rates increase 25% over the rate in effect on June 30, 1992. All dental rates shall be converted from the 50th percentile of 1989, less the percent in the aggregate that is necessary to equal the above increase. Laws 1992, chapter 513, article 7, § 130.

- Effective October 1, 1992, health plan capitation rates for health plans under contract with DHS to provide MA and GAMC services are adjusted to include 100% of the value of outpatient, physician, dental and inpatient DPA, small rural and technology increases. Laws 1992, Chapter 513, article 7, section 132.

### V. NURSING FACILITY SERVICES

*Minnesota Statutes* regulating Nursing Facilities were amended in several sections of the law. The general areas affecting nursing facilities include: the moratorium law, facility receiverships, the surcharge, the nursing operating and property costs, and cost report filing, appeals, record retention, and Department auditing.

#### Reimbursement and General Program Administration

Those specific section of the law which affect reimbursement and general program administration are: *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 144A.071 (moratorium), 144.073 (moratorium exceptions), 256.9657 (surcharge), 256B.0625 (MA swing beds), 256B.911 (case mix assessments), 256B.431 (nursing facility reimbursement), 256B.48 (MA participation and program administration), 256B.495 (nursing facility receivership), 256B.50 (rate and appraisal appeals), and 256B.74 (capital allowance and efficiency incentive).

The 1992 Legislative Session passed laws which significantly altered nursing facility reimbursement for facility property expenses. The primary mechanism for funding these changes is the provider surcharge. Nursing facility property reimbursement system was changed in several ways.

Effective October 1, 1992, providers property rates will be the greater of \$4.00 or their current property rate. In addition, the incremental increase in their rental rate over the rental rate in effect on September 30, 1992, will be added to their October 1st property rate. A facility which has been approved through the moratorium review process which meets certain requirements will receive an occupancy adjustment to its base property rate. Other property changes which may result in a property rate increase are: (1) the sale of a nursing facility within federal limits (effective 10/1/92); (2) certain capital repairs under \$150 per bed (effective July 1, 1993); (3) an equity incentive payment related to major capital additions, net of debt, which occur after June 30, 1993; (4) a 28 percent increase in the equipment allowance (effective October 1, 1992; and, (5) higher investment per bed limits for new major capital additions, with an interest expense pass-through moratorium projects for equipment, financing, and bond reserve costs related to the project. The new law also contains a refinancing incentive which permits the facility to keep one-half the computed annual interest expense savings. Any facility may opt to appeal their appraised value and, if successful, the new appraised value would be the base for future rate years beginning after June 30, 1993. Also, a facility's appraised value will be updated by adding the allowed cost

associated with capital asset projects, but only the base appraised value will be indexed for inflation. The capital asset additions will not be adjusted for inflation in the current or future rate years. The new law eliminates the capital equipment allowance of \$1.44 effective October 1, 1992.

The legislation affecting nursing facilities also provided for a higher equipment allowance, continuation of the short length of stay status for certain facilities, a 6 month extension for a facility with Huntington's residents to continue receiving higher operating cost limits, and a seven-tenths of one percent adjustment to the 21 month inflation factor. A new operating cost base year is required for both of the reporting years ending in 1991 and 1992. The commissioner will also rebase the maximum therapy rents for the rate years beginning after June 30, 1992. The surcharge expense will now be considered an allowable plant maintenance cost, and subject to the other operating cost limit. The maximum efficiency incentive amount will be index for inflation beginning July 1, 1993.

In addition, nursing facilities which have licensed but non-certified beds, or have agreements to phase-out of the Medical Assistance Program, may now elect to fully participate in the MA Program. The Moratorium law was also amended to permit two more exceptions to the Nursing Home Moratorium Law which will allow the replacement of a condemned facility, and an addition of twenty beds to another facility.

The law provides that all nursing home projects which exceed the lesser of 25 percent of appraised value or \$500,000, must be reviewed through the moratorium exceptions process. Certain specific exceptions were provided to this new requirement. The thresholds established under the new property system and in the moratorium law will be indexed for inflation.

Nursing facility receivership law and the law pertaining to central office cost allocation were amended to address issues relating to downsizing, closure, cost allocations, and rate adjustments for voluntary receiverships.

The Medical Assistance program as it applies to swing bed reimbursement in hospitals was expanded. The expansion permits MA payment for patients identified as terminally ill, provided certain restrictions and service limitations are adhered to.

Several more technical statutory amendments affecting nursing facilities were also made. They include:

- Permits reinstatement of the 20% rate reduction penalty for nursing facilities that have file incomplete or inaccurate cost reports;
- Permits nursing facilities good cause extensions on filing their cost reports; and,
- Nursing facility rate or appraisal appeals if postmarked or received before statutory deadline will be permitted.

#### ICFs/MR and Nursing Facilities

Technical statutory amendments made which affect both Nursing Facilities and ICF's/MR are as follows:

- Requires both ICF's/MR and Nursing Facilities to retain supporting documentation, including computer accounting systems, such as electronically generated media like magnetic discs and tape, for 5 years;
- Permits the Department in its process of auditing Nursing Facilities or ICF's/MR to make reasoned assumptions in the course of establishing payment rates where lack of adequate documentation is an issue;

#### ICFs/MR

The 1992 Session Laws, Chapter 513, also included riders which affect Intermediate Care Facilities for the Mentally Retarded (ICF/MR) Medical Assistance reimbursement.

- Authority for Commissioner to establish crisis capacity which is combined with a facility downsizing project.
- The mortgage equity requirement can be waived during fiscal year 1993 where the interest rate does not exceed state agency tax exempt financing.
- During fiscal year 1993, a facility in receivership that is sold to an un-related organization can be considered a new facility for rate setting purposes, and that facility's purchase price is limited to the historical cost of the prior owner's cost for physical plant, land, and land improvements.

#### **VI. GAMC CHANGES**

- Effective July 1, 1992, GAMC covers case management for a person with serious and persistent mental illness only if that person would have been eligible for MA but for his/her residency in an institution for mental diseases (IMD). Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256D.03, subd. 4 (Supp. 1991).
- Effective July 1, 1992, there is no age limit for GAMC eligibility. For GAMC recipients or applicants who have trust funds, the program will count as an asset the maximum amount of the trust that may be disbursed, assuming full exercise of trustee's discretion. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256D.03, subd. 3 (Supp. 1991).
- Effective July 1, 1992, a claim against the estate of a GAMC client has the same limitation and exclusions as does an MA claim. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.15, subd. 1 (1990).

### VII. OTHER

- Effective July 1, 1992, the commissioner may allow designated medical providers to purchase authorized materials through commodity contracts administered by the Commissioner of Administration for the purpose of submitting electronic claims to the MA program. Providers must be actively enrolled and participating in the MA program and must sign a hardware purchase and electronic biller agreement with the Commissioner prior to purchase from the contract. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256.9655, subd. 2 (1990).

- Effective July 1, 1992 the Commissioner may seek recovery of investigative costs from any vendor of medical care or services who willfully submits a claim for reimbursement for services the vendor knows, or reasonably should have known, is a false representation and which results in the payment of public funds for which the vendor is ineligible. Billing errors deemed to be unintentional, but which results in overcharges, shall not be considered for investigative cost recoupments. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.064, subd. 1d (1990).

- Effective July 1, 1992, the commissioner may terminate a provider's participation in the MA program if the provider is convicted under *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.064, subd. 1a. Amends *Minnesota Statutes*, § 256B.064, subd. 2 (Supp. 1991).

### **Request for Proposals to Provide Drug/Alcohol Screening/Testing Data**

**I. Purpose**

This request for proposal (R.F.P.) by the Board of Medical Practice (the "Board") is intended to facilitate the monitoring of drug/alcohol use by physicians practicing under restrictions and/or monitoring agreements. The purpose of this RFP is to let one or more one-year contracts to accomplish the scope of work, with options for subsequent year renewals.

**II. Scope of Work**

The Board is requesting proposals from organizations that will provide drug/alcohol testing data. The components being offered for bidding are Specimen Collection and Analysis. The components can be bid separately or together and are described as follows:

A. Specimen Collection: A system to routinely collect observed urine samples and, when appropriate, secure blood serum samples from any individual physician in Minnesota within one hour of the time designated by the Board or its designee. The Board will provide the vendor, in advance, the random collection schedule under which the vendor will work. Such schedule must be held in strict security in order for the tests to be valid. The Board reserves the right to order, at the Board's expense, additional body fluid samples other than the routine ones scheduled, upon reasonable notice to the vendor. The collection system must include procedures that guarantee the integrity and quality of the samples and must be carried out in adherence to a legal chain of custody requirements.

The vendor will deliver samples by mail or other acceptable means to the laboratory determined by the Board. The vendor will send samples in containers provided by the laboratory. The vendor will collect a service fee from each person who is the subject of body fluid monitoring. The Board will set the fee to be collected. Appendix B identifies the number and the location by zip code of physicians currently being screened for use of alcohol/drugs of abuse. This is provided for informational purposes to prospective vendors.

B. Laboratory Analysis: Vendor shall have the capacity to analyze urine and blood serum specimens, detecting alcohol and both licit and illicit drugs, utilizing methodologies that meet or exceed standards established by the National Institute of Drug Abuse (N.I.D.A.). The vendor will screen urine samples by an immunoassay method for a routine panel of drugs of abuse identified in Appendix A. The vendor will routinely confirm positive test results by Gas Chromatography/Mass Spectrometry (GC/MS) analysis. The vendor will screen blood serum samples for alcohol use only. The vendor will report all screen results to the Board or its designee within 72 hours of receipt of body fluid specimens. The vendor will immediately report positive results, when confirmed, to the Executive Director of the Board or his designee. The vendor will provide a monthly summary of the number of specimens tested by type and number of specimens testing positive by drug grouping/name to the Board or its designee.

The vendor will retain custody of any confirmed positive body fluid specimens for further testing consistent with N.I.D.A. and its own standards, as well as at the request of the Board of Medical Practice. In any event, such specimens will be maintained by the vendor until the Board or its designee concludes its action on the case and so notifies the vendor. The vendor will provide the Board with litigation support for specified additional fees.

The vendor will bill the Board for its analytical services that are not covered by billings to monitored physicians, on a quarterly basis.

### III. Billing—Pricing Requirements

A) The Board will establish fees to be paid by monitored physician for routine:

1) Specimen Collection

- Urine
- Blood

2) Analysis

- Urine
- Blood

B) Vendor will bill monitored physicians for collection and analysis, utilizing fees established by Board.

C) The Board will reimburse the vendor for the difference between charges billed to monitored physicians and the contract prices, as well as a monthly retainer for the initial contract year. The retainer is provided to cover fixed costs associated with low initial volume.

D) The state reserves the right to renew the contract resulting from this R.F.P., upon mutual agreement, for up to two years. Prices quoted here are good through the first one-year contract.

### IV. Volume of Drug/Alcohol Screens Anticipated

By the end of the first year of the contract, the Board anticipates that there will be at least 25 cases, each averaging 36 specimen collections and tests per year.
