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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The *State Register* is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the *State Register*. Published every Monday, the *State Register* makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific **Minnesota Rule** chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the **Minnesota Rules** are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the *State Register*.

An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as **Proposed Rules**, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the *State Register*. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the *State Register* as **Adopted Rules**. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the *State Register*, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The *State Register* features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule. If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed. If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

Board of Water and Soil Resources

Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Land and Water Treatment Program

The rules proposed and published at *State Register*, Volume 36, Number 42, pages 1341-1352, May 7, 2012 (36 SR 1341), and Volume 36, Number 43, page 1377, May 14, 2012 (36 SR 1377), are adopted with the following modifications:

8400.0300 APPROVED CONSERVATION PRACTICES.

Subp. 2. **Criteria for approved conservation practices.** Practices eligible for cost-share funds must meet the criteria in items A to D.

A. The objectives of the approved conservation practices may include, but are not limited to, activities that:

(10) ~~alleviate~~ address water quantity problems due to altered hydrology.

8400.0600 STATE BOARD ALLOCATION OF FUNDS TO DISTRICTS.

Subp. 4. **Grants to districts.** The state board ~~may~~ shall allocate cost-share funds to district boards that have fully complied with *Minnesota Statutes*, section 103C.501, subdivision 3; all erosion control and water management program rules; and program policies. ~~At least 70 percent of the cost-sharing funds available statewide will be allocated to districts in the form of grants for conservation practices addressing high priority erosion, sedimentation, or water quality problems. The remaining cost-share funds may be allocated by the board to districts for conservation practices for lower priority erosion, sedimentation, or water quality problems and for technical and administrative assistance or to carry out special projects or programs, except not more than 20 percent of the total funds may be allocated for technical and administrative services.~~

8400.0900 DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION OF PROGRAM FUNDS.

Subp. 5. **Entering into contract.** ~~After completion of the district board's, or its delegate's,~~ review of practice eligibility, the district board, or its delegate, shall approve or deny the application. If the application is approved, the district board, or its delegate, may enter into a contract with the land occupier.

8400.1700 MAINTENANCE.

Subpart 1. **Land occupier maintenance responsibilities.** The land occupier is responsible for operation and maintenance of conservation practices applied under this program to ensure that their conservation objective is met and the effective life is achieved. Should the land occupier fail to maintain the conservation practices during their effective life, the land occupier is liable to the ~~state of Minnesota~~ district for up to 150 percent of financial assistance received to install and establish the conservation practice. The land occupier is not liable for cost-share assistance received if the failure was caused by reasons beyond the land occupier's control, or if conservation practices are applied at the land occupier's expense which provide equivalent protection of the soil and water resources.

8400.1800 APPEALS.

Land occupiers may appeal a district's action within 60 days of receiving notice of the action by submitting a written request to the district board asking the board to reconsider its decision. Should the land occupier and the district board reach an impasse, the land occupier may petition to appeal the district board's decision to the state board within 60 days of receiving notice of the district board's final decision. The state board or its executive director, as delegated, shall review and grant the petition, unless it is deemed without sufficient merit, within 30 days of the receipt of the petition. The state board shall make its decision on the appeal, if granted, within 60 days of a hearing date. The state board's decision may uphold, remand, reverse, or amend the decision of the district board.

Adopted Rules

8400.3000 AUTHORITY.

Minnesota Statutes, sections 84.95, 103A.209, and 103F.501 to 103F.531, authorize the state board, in consultation with districts, private groups, and state and federal agencies, to implement a program to acquire easements on land to retire certain marginal agricultural land and protect environmentally sensitive areas to enhance soil and water quality, minimize damage to flood-prone areas, sequester carbon, and support native plant, fish, and wildlife habitats and to reestablish perennial cover and restore wetlands on that land. Parts 8400.3000 to 8400.3930 provide procedures and criteria to be followed by the state board and district boards in implementing *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 103F.501 to 103F.531. The state board shall implement the reinvest in Minnesota reserve program with district boards when practical, but may also implement the program directly ~~or through its authorized agents~~.

8400.3700 COST-SHARED PRACTICES.

Subp. 2. **Eligible costs for cost-shared practices.**

C. The state board reserves the right to approve and provide funding for cost-shared practices ~~directly or through its authorized agents~~.

Subp. 3. **Payment for in-kind services.** In-kind services provided by the landowner including, but not limited to, earthwork, seedbed preparation, and seeding, may be credited to the landowner's share of the total cost of establishing the cost-shared practice. The district board shall credit only those costs it determines to be practical and reasonable and may approve receipts or invoices directly or through its ~~authorized agents~~ delegate.

VR/Rehabilitation Services AND DDS MEDICAL/PSYCHOLOGICAL FEE SCHEDULE

DDS PAYMENT

The following boxed paragraph applies to the Disability Determination Services *only*.

INCENTIVES TO SUBMIT TIMELY REPORTS:

Psychiatric and psychological exams – DDS will pay providers 100% of either the usual and customary amount billed or 100% of the agency fee maximum, whichever is less, if the report is received from 1 to 10 days from the date of the examination (i.e. the day after the date of the examination is day 1). Reports received from 11 – 18 calendar days will be paid 90%.

Reports received 19 – 30 days from the date of the examination will be paid at a 75% rate.

For reports received 31 or more calendar days from the date of the examination, the DDS reserves the right to cancel the CE authorization invoice. Should the DDS decide to pay for such late evidence, the DDS will pay providers no more than 50% of either the usual and customary amount billed or 50% of the agency fee maximum, whichever is less.

All other consultative examinations:

Reports received by DDS 1-18 calendar days from the date of the examination (i.e. the day after the date of the examination is day 1), the DDS will pay providers 100% of either the usual and customary amount billed or 100% of the agency fee maximum, whichever is less.

Reports received by DDS from 19 – 30 days from the date of the examination will be paid 75%.

For reports received by the DDS 31 or more calendar days from the date of the examination, the DDS reserves the right to cancel the CE authorization invoice. Should the DDS decide to pay for such late evidence, the DDS will pay providers no more than 50% of either the usual and customary amount billed or 50% of the agency fee maximum, whichever is less.

Official Notices

Payment will not be issued until receipt of the signed CE report.

When a consultative examination provider chooses to utilize the transcription services available for use, a \$15.00 fee will be deducted from the total cost of the examination. The \$15.00 fee will not be charged for dictated reports re:

1. CEs performed by treating physicians/psychologists;
2. Limited CEs and office calls performed by regular CE providers; nor for
3. Reports from treating sources summarizing medical evidence of record.

LABORATORY AND X-RAY FEES

The subheadings are self-explanatory. The CURRENT PROCEDURAL TERMINOLOGY CODE corresponds to the American Medical Association's Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) codes, which are used by most sources providing medical services. These may also be used for easy in-agency identification of a particular procedure. When ordering and authorizing a particular laboratory or x-ray study, however, describe the test or x-ray to be done. Do not authorize by the CPT code.

X-ray charges may be presented in two possible formats: one combines the technical (the x-ray, itself) and professional (the physician's interpretation) components when these are provided by the same facility; the other format separates the technical and professional components when these services are provided by separate facilities.

For example: For a PA Chest X-ray, single view, one would find:

71010	Chest single view, PA	\$ 55.00
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This would be the acceptable maximum for an x-ray and interpretation at a single facility; however, when the **professional component** is billed separately, the procedure may be identified by adding the modifier **-26** to the usual CPT code. When the **technical component** is billed separately, the procedure may be identified by adding the modifier **-TC** to the usual CPT code.

Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) Environmental Analysis and Outcomes Division Request for Comments on Planned Amendments to Rules Governing Water Quality Variances, *Minnesota Rules* Chapters 7050, 7052, and 7053

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) is requesting comments on a specific addition to its previously noticed Request for Comments to amend water quality rules, *Minnesota Rules* chapters 7050 (Waters of the State) and 7053 (State Waters Discharge Restrictions). At this time the MPCA is seeking comments on one additional area of the water quality rules. Request for Comments on the amendments are requested from affected or interested parties. Comments should be submitted in writing in accordance with the provisions of this notice under the **Public Comment** section below.

Plain English Summary: This Request for Comments is the MPCA's legal notice of its intent to amend an additional rule chapter under the current water quality variance rulemaking effort. At this stage, we do not have a draft rule; we want your feedback to inform us about the ideas described under the **Subject of Rules** section below. If you have other ideas related to this rulemaking that we need to

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consider, please submit them in writing. For example, we recognize that costs to regulated parties can be a concern with rulemaking; if you have cost information or data related to this rulemaking that you wish to share with us to inform our decisions, please submit that information. Submitting your ideas and information to us at this stage in rulemaking allows us more time to address issues that may come up, and helps to ensure informed decision-making on our part.

Subject of Rules: The MPCA published a Request for Comments on October 1, 2012, regarding its intent to amend the rules governing water quality variances in *Minnesota Rules* chapters 7050 and 7053. In that request, the MPCA invited comment on planned amendments to eliminate inconsistencies in these rules governing the issuance of water quality variances. In this request, the MPCA is only seeking comment and information on the following additional amendment.¹

The additional amendment simply expands the *Minnesota Rules* chapters that may be affected in this rulemaking. The original request only identified *Minnesota Rules* chapters 7050 and 7053. As the MPCA began developing the amendments, it found that those amendments also affected some parts of *Minnesota Rules* chapter 7052 (Lake Superior Basin Water Standards), specifically, part 7052.0280, variances from water quality standards. Therefore, the MPCA found that it would also be appropriate to amend the variance rules in *Minnesota Rules* chapter 7052 as part of the rulemaking. Additionally, in response to the October 2012 request, the MPCA received comments also recommending amendments to the *Minnesota Rules* chapter 7052 variance rules. At this time the MPCA is considering amending part 7052.0280 to align the *Minnesota Rules* chapter 7052 variance rules with amendments to the *Minnesota Rules* chapter 7050 and 7053 variance rules; and to address applicability for new dischargers, and time frame and review of variances. The MPCA invites comment and information on these concepts.

Persons Affected: The planned amendments to the rules will affect the owners and operators of all facilities that may seek a variance from the water quality standards or effluent discharge restrictions. These facilities include Publicly Owned Treatment Works (i.e. municipal wastewater treatment facilities) and industrial dischargers authorized to discharge under a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System or State Disposal System permit.

Statutory Authority: *Minnesota Statutes*, section 115.03(1)(e) authorizes the MPCA to adopt, issue, reissue, modify, deny, or revoke permits, variances, standards, and rule.

Public Comment: Interested persons or groups may submit written comments or information on the planned rule amendments to *Minnesota Rules* part 7052.0280, from March 4, 2013, until 4:30 p.m. on April 4, 2013. Comments or information should be submitted to the contact person identified below. The MPCA will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules until more than 60 days have elapsed from the date of this Request for Comments.

Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR) REQUEST FOR COMMENTS on Possible Amendment to Rules Governing Metropolitan Area Local Water Management, *Minnesota Rules Chapter 8410*

Subject of Rule. The Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources requests comments on its possible amendment to the rule chapter governing local water management in the seven county metropolitan area. The rules are required by statute to establish standards and requirements for watershed management plans in the metropolitan area. The board is considering rule amendments that would update the 20 year old rules. There have been many changes in water management during the past two decades that necessitate rule amendments, including development of new best management practices (BMPs), storm water treatment systems, targeting systems using GIS and LIDAR, more data, increased data trend analyses, Clean Water Funding, identification of impaired waters and preparation of plans to address impaired waters. Rule amendments would move away from an overly prescriptive, one-size-fits-all approach to a more result-oriented framework. Future water management plans would consist of periodically updated inventories and goals, and frequently updated implementation and capital improvement sections.

Persons Affected. The amendment to the rules would likely affect watershed management organizations, counties, cities, towns, state agencies, environmental advocacy groups and individuals affected by water resources in the seven county metropolitan area.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 103B.201 through 103B.255, requires the board to adopt rules to govern local water management in the seven county metropolitan area.

Public Comment. The board will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules until more than 60 days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments. The board has an advisory committee to evaluate
