counties in this territory, may at any regular or special meetings of said boards, make such provision, and allow such bounties for the destruction of wolves in their respective counties as they may deem reasonable; the said bounty to be paid out of the treasury of the county wherein said wolf or wolves may be taken and killed.

Certificates.

(8.) SEC. II. That upon the proper oath being made before the clerk of the board of county commissioners, or justice of the peace of the proper county respectively, the said clerk or justice of the peace shall issue their certificates to the persons entitled thereto, which certificate, when issued, shall be received by the collector of the proper county, for county tax.

Record.

(9.) SEC. III. It shall be the duty of the several clerks of the boards of county commissioners to keep a true and perfect record of the amount of certificates issued as a premium for wolf scalps, to whom, and at what date, and lay the same before their respective boards, at each regular meeting thereof.

To be in force.

(10.) SEC. IV. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.

An Act relating to Auctioneers.

[Passed March 4, 1854.] c. 26

Auctioneers to be appointed.

(1.) SEC. I. *Be it enacted by the legislative assembly of the territory of Minnesota:* The governor of this territory shall appoint for the term of one year, one or more persons, who shall be legal voters, in each county in the territory, to be auctioneers, and the person or persons receiving such appointment, shall pay to the clerk of the board of county commissioners, for the use of said county where such persons reside, the sum of one hundred dollars annually.

When and how to take effect.

(2.) SEC. II. No appointment under this act shall take effect until the payment of the one hundred dollars mentioned in the first section of this act to the clerk of the board of county commissioners of the county in which said appointee shall reside, and it is hereby made the duty of the said clerk to record every appointment made and forthwith pay over to the treasurer of the county the amount so paid, taking the treasurer's receipt therefor.

To give bonds.

(3.) SEC. III. Each auctioneer, before making any sales as auctioneer shall give a bond to the treasurer of the county in which he or they reside, with two or more sufficient sureties, to be approved by the said treasurer,
