## CHAPTER VII.

## SALARIES.

## TITLE I.

## OF STATE OFFICERS.

1 SECTION 1. The salary of the governor is two thousand  
2 dollars per annum.

3 The lieutenant governor receives six dollars per day dur-  
4 ing the session of the legislature.

5 The salary of the secretary of state is twelve hundred  
6 dollars per annum.

7 The salary of the treasurer of state is one thousand dol-  
8 lars per annum.

9 The salary of the auditor of state is twelve hundred dol-  
10 lars per annum.

11 The salary of the attorney general is one thousand dollars  
12 per annum: and in addition thereto, he receives for atten-  
13 dance upon courts, five dollars per day for each day of ac-  
14 tual attendance, and in going to and returning from such  
15 court, mileage at the rate of ten cents per mile, to be com-  
16 puted from the capital.

17 The salary of the adjutant general is twelve hundred dol-  
18 lars per annum.

19 The salary of the commissioner of the state land office is  
20 three hundred dollars per annum.

21 The salary of the state librarian is six hundred dollars  
22 per annum.

23 The salary of the governor's private secretary is four  
24 hundred dollars per annum.

25 The salary of the assistant secretary of state is eight hun-  
26 dred dollars per annum.

27 The clerks of the state treasurer receive a salary of eight  
28 hundred dollars per annum.

29 The clerks of the state auditor receive a salary of eight  
30 hundred dollars per annum.

31 The clerks of the state land office receive a salary of six  
32 hundred dollars per annum.

33 The janitor of the capitol recives a salary of five hundred  
34 dollars per annum.

35 The salary of the warden of the state prison is eight hun-  
36 dred dollars per annum.

37 The salary of the deputy warden is five hundred dollars  
38 per annum.

- 39 The salary of the keeper of the state arsenal is four hun-  
 40 dred dollars per annum, in time of war, and one hundred  
 41 and fifty dollars per annum in time of peace.  
 42 The salary of each of the judges of the supreme court is  
 43 two thousand dollars per annum.  
 44 The salary of the clerk of the supreme court is six hun-  
 45 dred dollars per annum.  
 46 The salary of the reporter of the supreme court is five  
 47 hundred dollars per annum.

TITLE II.

OF DISTRICT OFFICERS.

- 1 SECT. 2. The salary of each of each of the judges of the <sup>c 56</sup>  
 2 district court is two thousand dollars per annum. c. S. p. 477, Sect. 18.

TITLE III.

- 1 SECT. 3. The county attorneys receive a salary of, not <sup>c 32</sup>  
 2 exceeding twelve hundred dollars per annum, to be fixed by 1862—p. 89, Sect. 7.  
 3 the board of county commissioners, and paid from the treas-  
 4 ury of the county.

- 1 SECT. 4. The salary of the county auditor and county <sup>c 2</sup>  
 2 superintendent of schools shall be fixed and determined by 1860—p. 64, Sect. 55,  
 & 1864—p. 20, Sect. 9 combined. c 1  
 3 the board of county commissioners, and paid from the county  
 4 treasury.

CHAPTER VIII.

COUNTIES AND COUNTY OFFICERS.

TITLE I.

TERRITORIAL DIVISIONS.

- 1 SECTION 1. The state is divided into the following coun-  
 2 ties: Aiken, Andy Johnson, Anoka, Becker, Benton, Big-  
 3 stone, Blue Earth, Brown, Carlton, Carver, Cass, Chippewa,  
 4 Chisago, Clay, Cottonwood, Crow Wing, Dakota, Dodge,  
 5 Douglas, Faribault, Fillmore, Freeborn, Goodhue, Henne-  
 6 pin, Houston, Isanti, Itasca, Jackson, Kanabec, Kandiyo-
