MASTER AND APPRENTICE

Laws 1941, Chapter 85, amending this section continues to state the terms which an apprentice agreement must contain; and was recommended for adoption by the voluntary apprenticeship council, section 178.02 who recommended this amendment because employers seemed to prefer hiring persons who, because of the wage and hours act, were not forced to limit the total number of hours spent at work to less than 40 hours per week. 26 MLR 227.
