

CHAPTER 110

DAMS; LAKE WATER LEVELS

Sections 110.01 to 110.12 repealed by L. 1947 c. 123 s. 7.

NOTE: The original act relating to dams is Ex. L. 1857, c. 39. This as amended and supplemented was codified as G. S. 1866, c. 31, relating to dams and mills, and chapter 32 relating to dams and booms. The original act establishing and controlling lake water levels is L. 1897 c. 88.

The commission created by L. 1945 c. 491, determined that the laws relating to the improvement of bodies of water by counties and municipalities were ambiguous and the sections in conflict. The legislature repealed sections 110.01 to 110.12, and to supersede the repealed sections enacted L. 1947 c. 123, coded as sections 110.121 to 110.126.

110.13 CONTROL OF SHORE LINES; VIOLATION.

Relating to the control of water levels and the flow of waters, the commissioner of conservation has veto power over other established statutory agencies, and other agencies may not proceed to make changes without the consent of the commissioner. 1944 OAG 60, July 28, 1944 (983-D).
