HOSPITAL FARM FOR INEBRIATES AND ASYLUM FOR THE INSANE

254.03 SUPERVISION BY DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS.

It is questionable if there is statutory authority permitting the transfer of a patient committed to a state asylum for inebriates to a hospital for the insane. OAG Oct. 18, 1932 (248-B-6).

254.04 TREATMENT OF INEBRIATES.

L. 1907, c. 288, entitled "An act creating and establishing a hospital farm for inebriates, and authorizing the state board of control to purchase lands therefor, and provide for the building and maintenance of such institution," is constitutional. *Leavitt v City of Morris*, 105 M 170, 117 NW 393.

254.07 POWERS OF DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS.

When the superintendent of the institution is satisfied a patient is no longer in need of institutional treatment, he may, with the consent of the director of public institutions, parole or discharge the patient. OAG Feb. 23, 1942 (248-B-6).

254.08 EXAMINATION BY PROBATE JUDGE; DUTIES OF JUDGE AND COUNTY ATTORNEY.
