

## CHAPTER 341

## ATHLETIC COMMISSION

**341.04 BOXING COMMISSIONER; POWERS; COMPENSATION; ASSISTANTS.**

Secretary of state athletic commission is in the unclassified service under the state civil service act. OAG May 1, 1942 (596-A).

**341.05 DUTIES OF COMMISSION.**

State athletic commission are not authorized to borrow money. OAG Feb. 27, 1934 (596-A).

**341.08 EXHIBITIONS; CONSENT REQUIRED.**

A contract, whereby plaintiff was to teach defendant boxing and to negotiate and manage boxing bouts or prize fights wherein defendant should be a contestant and divide the net proceeds with him and another, is not one which equity will specifically enforce or enjoin either party from the breaching, since the personal services therein to be rendered by defendant were not unique, nor does it appear that he was peculiarly qualified above others to render them. *Safro v Lakofsky*, 184 M 336, 238 NW 641.

Village may by resolution permit the holding of a boxing exhibition, but if a license fee is required, it must be by ordinance specifying the exact amount. OAG April 17, 1933 (477-B).

**341.11 RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

If based upon reasonable grounds, the rule of the commission prohibiting liquor advertisements in the printed programs of amateur exhibitions is legal. OAG Aug. 7, 1945 (596-a).

This section requires collection by the athletic commission of ten per cent of gross receipts from the holder of amateur bout for which a charge is made. Educational institutions are not excepted. OAG May 28, 1947 (596-B-6).

**341.12 BONDS.**

Licenses bond should contain the following phrase: "The term of this bond shall be for the period of one year commencing on the date when said license is issued." OAG July 17, 1946 (596-B).
